

Wednesday July 24th 1861

Comes with a fresh breeze from the N and fine weather steering in for the land at 3 P.M. the land at 3 miles distant at 4 halled on the wind heading E at sundown the land 28th 20 miles distant middle and latter part strong breeze from the S E and good weather at 2 A.M. tacked ship to the S W by S at 6 A.M. saw a ship to the S at 10 Spoke the Ship Petrel of R Bedford Capt Fuller 45 months out with 1500 lbs sperm Oil Bound to the Peper so ends this day
Lat by Obs 21.01 Long by Chro 177.50 W

Thursday July 25th 1861

Comences with a strong breeze from the S E and good weather steering by the wind to the S W at 6 P.M. tacked ship to the E middle part light wind at midnight tacked ship to the S W latter part light air at 11 A.M. wore ship to the E
Lat by Obs 21.27 Long by Chro 178.00 W

Friday July 26th 1861

Comes with a light breeze from the S E and fine weather steering by the wind to the E middle part light air and calm latter part light breeze from the S W steering S E employed breaking out bread and cooping it
Lat by Obs 21.42 Long by Chro 177.12 W

Saturday July 27th 1861

This day comes with a light breeze from the S W and fine weather steering S E at sundown wind from the W steering S by E latter part strong wind from the W at 5 A.M. steered S E by E
Lat by Obs 23.33 Long by Chro 176.08 W

Sunday July 28th 1861

Comes with strong wind from the W with a heavy sea steering S E by E at 6 P.M. double reefed the topsails and halled on the wind heading S E W middle part the same latter part moderate gales and cloudy steering by the wind heading S W saw Humpback whales
Lat by Obs 24.40 Long by Chro 176.18 W

Monday July 29th 1861

Comences with moderate gales from the W and squally some rain steering by the wind to the S W under double reefed topsails and foresail at sundown steered S by E middle part more moderate at midnight halled on the wind to the S W latter part moderate breeze from the S and fine weather steering S E employed in repairing main top galls
Lat by Obs 25.05 Long by Chro 175.10 W

Tuesday July 30th 1861

First part light wind from the W and fine weather steering S E employed repairing main sail at sundown halled on the wind to the S middle and latter part moderate with fine weather steering S E at 6 A.M. saw a ship to the E
Lat by Obs 24.49 Long by Chro 174.12 W

Wednesday July 31st 1861

Comes with a fresh breeze from the W and fine weather steering to the Eastward at 2 P.M. spoke the Ship Panus of R Bedford Capt Smith 32 months 1200 lbs Whale Oil middle and latter part squally with rain wind from the S W steering by the wind to the S W saw several finbacks the Panus in sight to the S
Lat by Obs 25.07 Long by Chro 173.00 W

Thursday August 1st 1861

Comes with strong winds from the S W and squally at 3 P.M. wind halled to the S W with fresh gales took in all sail and lay to heading S E at 6 P.M. wore ship to the W the Panus in sight middle part the same latter part strong breeze from the W and squally two ships in sight Lat by Obs 24.48 Long by Chro 175.09 W

Wednesday Aug 2^d 1861

Comes with fresh breeze from the S W and squally steering by the wind to the S two ships in sight at sundown took in sail for the night middle and latter part the wind from the S W and squally at 6 A.M. set whole topsails and steered S E
Lat by Obs 25.09 Long by Chro 174.30 W
