

Saturday August 3<sup>rd</sup> 1861

Commences with a strong breeze from the S and good weather steering S S E at 6 P.M. wore ship to the west and took in sail for the night. middle part the same at daylight set all sail saw Whales lowered 4 Boats killed One whale got 2 Boats stove One Badley at meridian took the whale to the ship light wind from the S W

Lat By Obs 25.13. S Long 174.26 W

Sunday August 4<sup>th</sup> 1861

First part Calm at 1 P.M. commenced cutting at dark Got the Boddy in ship heading to all points of the compass middle part calm employed in getting ready to Boil at 4 Am commenced to Boil latter part light wind from the W and fine weather at 6 Am hooked on to the head and cut it in at meridian finished Bailing the case and set the topsails and steered by the wind to the South

Sunday Aug 4<sup>th</sup> 1861

Commences with moderate breeze from the W and fine weather steering by the wind to the South employed in Boiling Being in West Longitude Change the Day which brings two Sundays together at sunset wore ship to the S W and took in sail for the night middle part fresh breeze and fine weather latter part strong wind and squally set the Top sails double reefed at 11 Am took in fore and mizen topsails and Close reefed the main

Lat by Obs 24.44 S Long by Chro 173.03 W

Monday Aug 5<sup>th</sup> 1861

Commences with fresh gales from the W S W and squally heading by the wind to the S Boiling middle part strong gales with a heavy sea at 10 P.M. cooled down the works latter part fresh gales from the S W at 7 Am set the Foresail and started the tryworks again at 11 set the fore and mizen topsails Double reefed heavy sea running

Tuesday August 6<sup>th</sup> 1861

Comes with a strong Gale from the S W and good weather steering by the wind to the S E at 2 took in Fore and mizen topsails at 5 finished Boiling turned up 90 lbs muddle part. more moderate latter part moderate breeze from the S W and good weather at daylight set the fore and mizen topsails double reefed and whole main topsail at 9 wore ship to the southward at daylight Commenced to Break out the main hatch to stow Oil saw a number finbacks and one Ship

Wednesday August 7<sup>th</sup> 1861

Comes with a moderate breeze from the W and fine weather steering by the wind to the S employed in stowing Oil at 5 P.M. saw a large Sperm whale goin quick to the N E lowered the Boats with out seeing the whale from the Boat took the Boat up and took in sail for the night middle and latter part fresh Gales from the W and good weather heading by the wind to the North under double reefed maintop sail & foresail at 11 Am set the fore and mizen topsails Double reefed employed in stowing off the Hold

Lat by Obs 25.78 Long by Chro 173.45 W

Thursday August 8<sup>th</sup> 1861

Commences with moderate Gales from the W and fine weather steering by the wind to the S at sunset wore ship to the S W and took in the Fore and mizen topsails at 3 P.M. finished stowing and washed the decks middle part strong wind and fine weather at 6 Am set double reefed topsails to the S W latter part fresh gales from the S W steering by the wind to the Westward at 10 Am found the starboard Fore Topmast Back stays stranded employed in getting up Percenter stays and Repairing Bow Boat a very heavy sea from the S
