

Saturday November 16<sup>th</sup> 1861

Commences with strong wind from the S.W. and hazy steering by the wind to the N.W. with double reefed Top Sails at 5 P.M. finished setting the Try Sail at 7. Hoisted Ship to the E and took in fore and Mizzen Top Sails middle and latter part moderate Gale with fog at daylight set double reefed Top Sails and steered by the wind to the E.S.E. at 5 A.M. commenced to break out to stow down Oil

Sunday November 17<sup>th</sup> 1861

Comes with moderate Gale from the S.W. and thick rainy weather steering to the E.S.E. with double reefed Top Sails at 8 P.M. took in fore and Mizzen Top Sails at 8 finished stowing down 67 bls Oil middle part strong wind and thick rainy weather at daylight more moderate with thick fog at 8 wind halled to the Eastward and cleared a little at 11 A.M. saw 2 whales lored to Boat struck both of them killed one and parted from the other

Monday November 18<sup>th</sup> 1861

Commences with a strong breeze from the E with thick rainy weather at 1 P.M. took the whale to the Ship at 3 commenced to cut at 4 finished cutting and set quarter watches and cleared up the deck middle and latter part light breeze and foggy at daylight called all hands and commenced to boil at 10 A.M. wind from the S set the Top Sails and wore ship to the Eastward

Tuesday November 19<sup>th</sup> 1861

Commences with light wind from the S and hazy at 4 P.M. rainy steering by the wind to the Eastward Employed in Boiling middle part light baffling air with rain latter part moderate breeze from the S and Cloudy at 7 A.M. saw a white whale lored to Boat struck and parted from him at 10 came Onboard at 11 lored again could not get fast one or two other Whales in sight

Wednesday November 20<sup>th</sup> 1861

Comes with fresh wind from the South with fine weather lored for Whales twice this P.M. could not get fast they were going quick to the windward at 3 P.M. finished Boiling at half Past 7 took in sail for the night and lay by the wind to the W at daylight set all sail and wore ship to the E.S.E. at 10 A.M. lored and killed a whale at Meridian the whale 3 miles to the windward working for the whale

Thursday November 21<sup>st</sup> 1861

Commences with a strong wind from the S with a heavy sea at 3 P.M. took the whale to the Ship got thinner and got ready to cut at 8 hooked On and took one lip and gave it up it being so rugged middle and latter part fresh Gales from the S and hazy weather with a heavy sea running laying with the whale along side employed in starting Oil in to the Tank

Lat By Obs 41.42 Long By Obs 166.00

Friday November 22<sup>d</sup> 1861

Comes with fresh Gale from the S and Good weather loring by the Whale to rigged to Cut employed Breaking Out for Tubs middle and latter part more moderate with a heavy swell from the S at 4 A.M. wore ship and commenced to cut the whale took the lips and head and found the whale to be a dry skin cut the flukes off and let her go and made Sail to the west and commenced to break out to stow Oil nothing in sight

Saturday November 23<sup>d</sup> 1861

Comes with a strong wind from the S.W. and Good weather steering by the wind to the west with double reefed topsails set employed in stowing down Oil at 6 P.M. saw a whale lored to Boat could not get fast took the Boat up and took in sail for the night middle part moderate breeze latter part light air lored for whales with out success employed in stowing down oil stowed down 72 bls
