

Sunday November 24th 1861

Commences with calm and fine weather at 8 PM loosed for a whale could not get fast middle part calm latter part light breeze from the S steering S by W with all sail set

Lat By Obs 40.26 Long by Chron 160.22

Monday November 25th 1861

Commences with moderate breeze from the S and fine at 2 PM loosed for whale and chased them till night took the Boat up and took in sail for the night middle and latter part strong winds from the S and fine weather at daylight set all sail and steered S E at 7 loosed for whale struck 2 killed One and dragged from the other at 11 took the whale to the ship and got ready to cut Lat By Obs 41.12 Long by Chron 160.27

Tuesday November 26th 1861

Commences with a strong wind from the S and fine at 1 PM commenced to cut the whale at 5 finished cutting at 6 took in sail for the night and headed to the S E at 7 began to Boil middle and latter part strong wind from the S and fine weather at daylight set double reefed Top Sails at 6 wore ship to the Westward at 11 steered E by S employed in Boiling

Come

Wednesday November 27th 1861

with a strong wind from the S and fine weather steering E at 2 PM steered S W at sundown took in sail and lay by the wind to the S W employed in Boiling middle part strong winds and squally with rain latter part fresh gales from the S E laying under double reefed main Top sail and Fore sail at 8 AM finished Boiling

Thursday November 28th 1861

Comes with a fresh Gale from the E S E and good weather heading to the S under short sail at 6 took in Foresail and close reefed main Top sail middle part more moderate latter part strong winds from the E and good weather set double reefed Top Sails and steered by the wind heading S E employed in stowing Oil

Lat By Obs 41.11 Long by Chron 160.45

Friday November 29th 1861

Comes with fresh breeze from the E and fine weather steering by the wind heading S E at 4 saw 2 Whales going quick to the S did not loir at 5 finished stowing 53 lbs Oil at 7 took in sail for the night heading S E middle part calm latter part moderate breeze from the S W at daylight set all sail and steered S E at 4 saw whales loosed 4 Boats struck and killed One working the ship to the whale two Boats in chase of other whales

No Obs

Saturday November 30th 1861

Comes with fresh Breeze from the S W and Cloudy at 1 PM took the whale alongside at 2 struck and killed another whale at 7 took him to the Ship and took in sail and got dinner and supper middle and latter part fresh breeze from the S at 4 AM called all hands and commenced cutting the whales at meridian one in and the head of the other

No Obs

Sunday December 1st 1861

Comes with light Air from the S at 3 finished cutting at 4 commenced to Boil wore ship to the westward nothing in sight middle and latter part fresh from the S W and good weather at daylight set whole Top Sails and steered by the wind to the westward at meridian wore ship to the S employed in Boiling

Lat By Obs 40.42 Long by Chron 161.17

Monday December 2nd 1861

Commences with a strong wind from the S W and Cloudy steering by the wind to the S E at 6 o'clock took in sail for the night middle and latter part fresh Gales from the S W with squalls of rain laying under close reefed main Top sail and Fore sail heading to the S Boiling a heavy sea running
