

Thursday January 2^d 1862

Comes with a strong wind from the N and hazy at half past 12 braced forward the main yard at 2 took in Topgallant sails at 3 double reefed Top Sails thick and rainy at 5 fresh gales took in sail and wore ship to the Eastward the Bark in sight at 2 P.M. to the S middle part more moderate at daylight set double reefed Top Sails and steered by the wind to the N wind from the N.W. at 9 Am wore ship W.S.W. and set whole Top Sails and mainsail strong wind with heavy sea
Lat by Obs 45.59 Long by Chro 159.47

Friday January 3^d 1862

Commences with a strong wind from the N and clear steering by the wind to the westward with whole topsails at 7 fresh Gales took in sail to close reefed main Top sail and Fore Sail and wore ship to the E.N.E. middle part more moderate at daylight set double reefed Top Sails latter part fresh Gales from the N.W. and squally steering by the wind to the W at meridian strong Gales with heavy squalls took in all but Storm Sails wind halting gradually to the S
Lat by Obs 46.18 Long by Chro 160.33

Saturday January 4th 1862

Comes with strong Gales from S.W. with heavy squalls laying by the wind to the S at 5 P.M. wore ship to the N.W. middle and latter part strong Gales with squalls of rain laying under Storm Sails to the Westward a heavy sea running
Lat by Obs 45.45

Sunday January 5th 1862

Commences with strong Gale from the S.W. with squalls of rain a heavy sea heading to the westward under storm Sails middle part more moderate at daylight set double reefed Top Sails and steered by the wind to the N at 5 Am wore ship to the S.E. latter part moderate wind and cloudy at meridian set all Sail large sea running

Lat by Obs 45.34 Long by Chro 160.00

Monday January 6th 1862

Commences with moderate wind from the S.W. and cloudy steering S.E. at 4 P.M. steered S by E wind N.W. at 7 took in Sail for the right middle and latter part strong wind from the W.S.W. and foggy at 6 Am set the Top Sails and steered by the wind to the S.W.

Tuesday January 7th 1862

Comes with a strong wind from the N.W. and hazy steering by the wind to the S.W. at 5 double reefed the topsails at 6 took all but Storm Sails and wore ship to the N middle part more moderate latter part light air and fine weather at daylight set all sail and steered by the wind to the N wind from S.W.
Lat by Obs 46.40 Long by Chro 160.43

Wednesday January 8th 1862

Commences with a light breeze from the N and fine clear weather steering by the wind to the S at 7 P.M. saw three or four whales 4 miles distant called them Fin Backs. took in sail for the night heading to the S middle and latter part calm and fine
Lat by Obs 46.52 Long by Chro 160.42

Thursday January 9th 1862

Comes with calm and fine weather at 2 P.M. light air from the N.W. steering by the wind to the S at 7 light air from the S.W. at sunset took in sail for the right middle and latter part fresh breeze at daylight set all sail and steered by the wind to the S at meridian wind from the N.W. saw several Fin Backs
Lat by Obs 47.30 Long by Chro 160.45

Friday January 10th 1862

Commences with strong wind from the N.W. and good weather steering by the wind to the Westward at 2 took in Topgallant sails at 7 fresh Gales took in sail for the right middle and latter part fresh gales and squally with rain at daylight set double reefed Top Sails steering by the wind to the N
