

Monday February 17th 1862

Commences with strong wind from the S and cloudy steering by W at sunset double reefed the Main Topsail at halled on the wind to the ESE middle part strong wind from the SE at 1 AM wore ship to the W at daylight saw the Poor Knights bearing SW 15 miles distant. latter part squally and thick at 11 AM saw Cape Brett NW 10 miles at meridian wore ship to the SE wind from the SE thick and rainy

Tuesday February 18th 1862

Comes with strong wind from NNE with thick rainy weather steering by the wind to the SE at 2 double reefed topsails at 4 wore ship to the W middle part thick and rainy at 6 Cape Brett SW 10 miles distant latter part wind from the WSE working ship in to the land at meridian Cape Brett S 6 miles distant at

Wednesday February 19th 1862

Comes with fresh breeze from the NNE and fine weather at 1 PM went up to the Town to get some men that ran away got one John Gallagher and took him Onboard at 7 PM and steered to the SE wind from the S at 6 AM wind from the SE at 3 AM saw a sperm whale going very fast to the windward did not load for him

Thursday February 20th 1862

Comes with moderate breeze from the SSE and fine weather steering by the wind to the E at 6 PM steered SE middle and latter part the same employed repairing main sail
Lat by Obs 33.34 Long by Chron 176.18

Friday February 21st 1862

Comes with airs from the E and fine weather steering SE middle and latter part wind and weather the same at 8 AM saw sperm whales lowered 4 Boats at 10 AM and killed one at meridian took the whale to the Ship three Boats in chase of the whales at 3 P
Lat by Obs 33.06 Long by Chron 176.35

Saturday February 22nd 1862

Commences with light airs from the E and fine weather three Boats in chase of whales at 3 took the Boats up and commenced to cut at 5 finished cutting. steering WNW the course the whales were going middle and latter part the same at daylight commenced to Boil saw nothing this day
Lat by Obs 32.46 Long by Chron 175.53

Sunday February 23rd 1862

Comes with a light breeze from the E and fine weather steering NWSE employed Boiling at 4 PM luffed to the E middle and latter part wind from the ESE at midnight finished, boiling at daylight wore ship to the SE saw nothing this day
Lat by Obs 32.49 Long by Chron 176.25 Long by Lines 176.05

Monday February 24th 1862

Comes with fresh breeze from the E and fine weather steering by the wind to the NNE at 2 PM saw a Bark steering to the S at sunset took in Top Gallantsails middle part strong wind with squalls latter part fresh gales at 10 AM double reefed the Top Sails and furled the mainsail wore ship to the SE
Lat by Obs 33.01 Long by Chron 176.40.

Tuesday February 25th 1862

Comes with fresh Gales from the E and cloudy steering by the wind to the NNE with double reefed Top Sails middle and latter part squally with some rain at midnight took in jib and spanker at 2 AM close reefed the Top Sails at meridian took in Fore and Mizzen Topsails a strong Gale from the ESE
No Obs

Wednesday February 26th 1862

Comes with strong Gales from the ESE and squally heading to the SE under Storm Sails middle and latter part the same
Lat by Obs 31.36
