

Monday March 17th 1862

Cornes with a strong wind from the S and good weather
three sail in sight at 4 saw the whales again lored
three Boats struck and killed one at 9 P.M. took him
to the ship and took in sail heading to the N.E. wind
from E.S.E. middle part laying by the whale latter part
moderate Gale with heavy sea at 5 called all hand and wore
ship to the S.E. By 9 wind from the E. at 7 commenced to
cut 2 Part 11 Got his head off at meridian cutting the Boddy
Lat by Obs 31.38 Long by Chro 179.37

Tuesday March 18th 1862

Cornes with fresh gale from the E.S.E. and squally
at 2 got the Boddy in at three hooked on to the head
at 5 P.M. got through bailing the Case and set the fore
sail heading S.E. by S middle and latter part fresh Gale
at 4 A.M. commenced to boil at daylight set double reefed
Bopsails steering by the wind to the S.E. one ship in sight
Lat by Obs 32.46 Long by Chro 179.58 E

Wednesday March 19th 1862

Cornes with strong double reefed topsail breeze from the
the E.S.E. and good weather steering by the wind to the S.E.
at 6 P.M. wore ship to the S.E. employed Boiling
middle and latter part fresh gale and good weather steering
by the wind to the S.E. saw one sail.
Lat by Obs 31.51 Long by Chro 179.30 W

Thursday March 20th 1862

Cornes with fresh gales from the E and good weather steering
by the wind to the S.E. at 6 P.M. finished Boiling and
wore ship to the S.E. middle and latter part same
as first part at 2 A.M. wore ship to the S.E. employed in
breaking out for casks and getting ready to stow Oil
Lat by Obs 31.46 Long by Chro 179.21

Friday March 21st 1862

Commences with strong wind from the E.S.E. and fine weather
steering by the wind to the S.E. with double reefed Bopsails set
at 1 P.M. saw a Bark. at 6 wore ship to the S middle and latter
part strong winds and squally at 3 A.M. wore ship to the
S.E. at 9 spoke the Bark
with 1450 lbs sperm oil. employed in stowing Oil in the
after hold starboard side one ship in sight
Lat by Obs Long by Chro

Saturday March 22^d 1862

Cornes with strong wind from the E and blustering steering
by the wind to the S.E. employed in stowing Oil at 6 P.M.
wore ship to the S middle and latter part strong wind from
the E.S.E. and good weather at 3 A.M. wore ship to the S.E.
employed stowing Oil in the after hold several Gale in
sight
Lat by Obs 31.46 Long by Chro 179.05

Sunday March 23^d 1862

Commences with strong wind from the E.S.E. and fine weather
steering by the wind to the S.E. with whole topsails set
at 4 P.M. finished stowing down 1200 lbs Sperm Oil French
rock in sight to the S.E. 20 miles distant middle part
strong wind latter part fresh breeze from the E at daylight
set all sail to the S.E. the Bark S.E. 20 miles at 7 A.M.
wore ship to the South saw nothing this day
Lat by Obs 31.36 Long by Chro 179.19

Monday March 24th 1862

Cornes with moderate breeze from the E and fine weather
steering by the wind to the S.E. at 6 P.M. took in sail for the
Sight middle and latter part light wind and fine weather
at daylight set all sail and steered by the wind to the
S.E. employed breaking out the fore Peak for shocks
Lat by Obs 32.03 Long by Chro 179.10
