

Saturday April 19th 1862

Commences with light air from the S^W steering to the S^W employed cutting up the whales bank and killing the cow at 6 more ships and steered S^E by S and commenced to boil Sunday Island S 25 miles distant middle part light breeze from the S^W latter part light breeze from the E at 6 more ships to the S and set all sail employed in boiling Macaulay Island S 25 miles distant

Sunday April 20th 1862

Comes with light breeze from the S^E and good weather steering S^E by S employed in boiling at sunset Macaulay Island S 25 miles distant took in sail halled on the wind to the eastward middle part strong wind and raining at 10 A.M. finished boiling latter part fresh gales with much rain at 7 P.M. in all sail except storm sails laying by the wind to the S^E

Monday April 21st 1862

Comes with strong gales from the E^{SE} and rainy ship heading to the S^E at 3 P.M. wind halled to the S^W and cleared off some middle part squally latter part more moderate at 7 A.M. set double reefed top sails and steered by the wind to the S^W wind from the west at 10 saw a spot supposed to be sperm whales but saw no more of it

Tuesday April 22nd 1862

Commences with a strong wind from the S^W with a Red sea steering by the wind to the S^W with double reefed top sails at 6 P.M. more ship to the S^W middle and latter part fresh gales and squally at daylight more ship to the S^W

Lat by Obs 30.01 Long by Chro 177.23

Wednesday April 23rd 1862

Comes with fresh gales from the S^W and squally at 2 P.M. close reefed top sails and furled the fore sail ship heading S^W middle part the same latter part strong wind from the S^W at daylight set the courses heading S^W

Lat by Obs 28.45 Long by Chro 177.45

Thursday April 24th 1862

Commences with a strong wind from the S^W steering S^W by S at sunset took in sail for the night and halled on the wind to the Westward middle and latter part the wind and weather the same at daylight set double reefed top sails and steered S^W by S employed storing oil in the after hold Starboard Side

Friday April 25th 1862

Comes with strong wind from the S^W and good weather steering S^W by S at 6 P.M. finished storing 48 bbls and took in sail and halled on the wind to the S^E middle part the wind the same at 10 A.M. more ship to the westward at daylight set whole main top sail and main top Gallant sail and steered S^{SE} wind from the S

Lat by Obs 26.44 Long by Chro 176.47

Saturday April 26th 1862

Comes with strong wind from the S^E and good weather steering S^{SE} at sunset took in sail for the night and halled on the wind to the S^{SE} middle and latter part wind from about E^{SE} at daylight set all sail and steered by the wind to the S^E

Lat by Obs 25.41 Long by Chro 175.44

Sunday April 27th 1862

First part moderate breeze from the E^{SE} and good weather steering by the wind to the S^E at sunset took in sail for the night middle part light air and a baffling with rain latter part light air from the S^W steering S^W with all sail set

Lat by Obs 25.07 Long by Chro 175.33

Monday April 28th 1862

Commences with light air from the S^W and fine weather steering S^W at 5 loosed for Black Fish got none at dark took in sail and headed to the S^W middle and latter part light baffling air and calm ship heading to all points of the compass
