

Tuesday April 29th 1862

Commences with a strong light air from the SE and Cloudy steering to the Eastward at dark took in sail for the night middle and latter part light breeze from the S and good weather at daylight set all sail and steered to the E

Wednesday April 30th 1862

Commences with light breeze from the SSW and fine weather steering to the E at 1 P.M. saw a ship to the SE at 4 Yoke the James Murry of New Bedford Capt King 150 Gperm since leaving the Bay off Island middle part light air latter part light breeze from SW steering to the SE at meridian steered SE

Thursday May 1st 1862

First part light Wind from the WSW and fine weather steering to the SE at dark took in sail and halled on the wind to the SW middle and latter part light air from the S and Cloudy at daylight set all sail and steered SE

Friday May 2nd 1862

First part Calm and Cloudy heading to all points the Compass at dark double reefed the Top Sails middle part light Baffling air latter part light breeze from the S and Cloudy at daylight set all sail and steered to the SE

Saturday May 3rd 1862

Comes with a fresh breeze from the E and Cloudy steering by the wind to the SSE at sundown took in sail for the night middle and latter part wind and weather the same at daylight set all sail and steered SSW

Sunday May 4th 1862

Commences with strong wind from the E and fine weather steering SW at 1 P.M. saw a ship at 4 spoke the Herald off New Bedford capt Little 650 bls at dark took in sail for the night middle and latter part strong wind at daylight set whole top sails and steered by the wind to the SE at meridian double reefed the topsails one ship in sight

Monday May 5th 1862

Comes with strong wind from the ESE and good weather steering by the wind to the SE under double reefed Top Sails at dark took in sail for the night middle and latter part strong wind and Cloudy at daylight steered by the wind to the SE with double reefed Top sails the Herald in sight

Lat By Obs 25.15 Long by Chro 173.46

Tuesday May 6th 1862

Comes with strong wind from the SE and good weather steering by the wind to the ESE at dark close reefed the top Sails and wore ship to the S the Ship Herald in sight to the W middle and latter part fresh gales latter part steering by the wind to the ESE

Lat By Obs 24.52 Long By Chro 173.22

Wednesday May 7th 1862

Comes with fresh gales from the SE and good weather steering by the wind to the ESE with close reefed Top Sails set at dark wore ship to the SSW middle and latter part fresh gales and good weather at daylight set double reefed top Sails and steered by the wind to the ESE a ship in sight to the S

Lat By Obs 24.35 Long by Chro 173.07

Thursday May 8th 1862

Commences with strong wind from the SE and good weather steering by the wind to the SE One ship in sight middle and latter part strong wind and good weather at daylight set double reefed topsails and steered by the wind heading ESE
