

Tuesday May 20th 1862

Commences with a strong breeze from the W and fine weather steering by the wind to the S S W at 2 P.M. steered S E by E middle and latter part strong breeze from the W and fine weather steering S E by E with all sail set employed setting up rigging
Lat by Obs 20.25 Long by Chron 171.24

Wednesday May 21st 1862

Comes with moderate breeze from the W and fine weather steering S E by E with all sail set at 6 P.M. squally some rain middle and latter part light breeze from the W and fine weather steering S E by E with all sail set at 10 A.M. saw Savage Island bearing S S W hauled up
Lat by Obs 19.25 Long by Chron 170.25

Thursday May 22^d 1862

Comes with light breeze from the W and cloudy steering by the wind to the S S W at dark the land S S E 15 miles distant middle part the same latter part light air from the S W steering S E by E with all sail set
Lat by Obs 18.34 Long by Chron 170.50

Friday May 23^d 1862

Commences with light air from the S and fine weather steering S at 6 P.M. light breeze from the S E middle part the same latter part fresh breeze steering S E by E
Lat by Obs 16.56

Saturday May 24th 1862

Comes with strong wind from the S E and squally steering S E by E with all sail set at 2 P.M. took in Topgallant sails at 6 look in the main sail middle part squally with rain at 10 P.M. double reefed the Top Gails at daylight set under main Top sail. weather thick and rainy at 8 saw the Manona Island S 10 miles distant steered S S W at 10 A.M. light airs and varying with plenty of rain

S.S. Obs

Sunday May 24th 1862

Commences with light air and haffling steering W at 4 P.M. saw the Island of Boutouila S 10 leagues distant steered W S W weather thick and squally at 4 P.M. wind from the W steering by the wind to the S at daylight Boutouila S 20 miles Opoulou S W 40 miles latter part Calm two ships in sight
Lat by Obs 13.44

Monday May 25th 1862

Comes with light air from the S heading to the S with all sail set at dark Boutouila S E Opoulou W 30 miles heading in for the land with a very light air middle part the same latter part light breeze from the S E and fine weather at meridian the harbor of Apia S S W 20 miles distant

Tuesday May 26th 1862

Comes with light breeze from the S E and fine weather steering in for the harbor at 5 P.M. the Pilot came on Board and backed off shore middle part standing off and on latter part fresh breeze from the S E and fine weather at 11 A.M. came to anchor in Apia Harbor and lay there untill the 10th of June at

Wednesday June 11th 1862

Comes with a strong E wind at 2 P.M. got under way and stood to sea at 4 P.M. went on shore the ship lying off and on middle and latter part strong winds and squally with rain the ship off the harbor

Thursday June 12th 1862

Comes with strong winds from the S E and squally at 3 P.M. P. went on Board and stood off shore at dark double reefed the topsails middle and latter part strong winds and squally working to the S under double reefed topsails at daylight bearing S 15 miles distant wore ship and stood to the S E thick and squally
