

Friday June 13<sup>th</sup> 1862

Comes with strong winds from the ESE and squally steering by the wind to the SE middle part the same at midnight wore ship to the S latter part strong wind and cloudy at meridian Upolo 70 miles distant  
Lat by Obs 13.51 Long by Chro 171.30

Saturday June 14<sup>th</sup> 1862

Comes with strong winds from the ESE and good weather steering by the wind to the S at 4 tacked ship to the SE East end of Upolo 92 miles distant middle and latter part strong wind and fine weather at daylight tacked ship to the S at meridian Butuilla 98 miles distant  
Lat by Obs 13.51 Long by Chro 170.55

Sunday June 15<sup>th</sup> 1862

Comes with strong breeze from the ESE and fine weather steering by the wind to the S at 2 tacked to the SE at dark the E end of Butuilla 94 miles distant middle part squally at 3 am tacked to the S latter part wind from the E with strong squalls steering by the wind to the south with whole topsails at meridian Butuilla 97 miles distant  
Lat by Obs 14.00 Long by Chro 170.25

Monday June 16<sup>th</sup> 1862

Commences with a strong wind from the E with heavy squalls of wind and rain steering by the wind to the S with whole topsails set middle part squally with rain latter part fresh wind and fine weather steering SE  
Lat by Obs 16.15 Long by Chro 169.57

Tuesday June 17<sup>th</sup> 1862

Comes with light breeze from the SE and Sunday steering SE with all sail set middle part the wind the same steering SE & latter part calm employed repairing the fore sail  
Lat by Obs 17.02 Long by Chro 169.49

Wednesday June 18<sup>th</sup> 1862

First part calm and pleasant at 9 PM moderate breeze from the SE and increasing latter part strong wind and cloudy steering by the wind to the SSW with main & topgallant sail set  
Lat by Obs 15.10 Long by Chro 171.05

Thursday June 19<sup>th</sup> 1862

Comes with strong winds from the SE and cloudy steering by the wind to the SSW at 3 took in main & topgallant sail at 6 double reefed the top sails and wore ship to the ESE middle part fresh gales and squally at 10 took in the mainsail at 2 AM set it again latter part squally at 6 AM wore ship to the S  
Lat by Obs 15.39

Friday June 20<sup>th</sup> 1862

Comes with fresh gales and squally at 2 past meridian took in the main sail at 2 took in fore & spanker at 5 close reefed the top sails and wore ship to the SE wind from the ESE and squally middle and latter part strong gales at 6 AM wore ship to the S ship under close reefed topsails  
Lat by Obs 19.05 Long by Chro 171.05

Saturday June 21<sup>st</sup> 1862

Commences with fresh gales from the ESE and cloudy steering by the wind to the S under close reefed top sails middle part strong gales and squally at 12 midnight took in fore and main topsails and fore sail latter part strong gales lying under storm sails to the S  
Lat by Obs 19.11 Long by Chro 171.33

Sunday June 22<sup>d</sup> 1862

Comes with strong gales from the ESE laying heaving to the S under storm sails middle and latter part strong gales from the E at 4 AM set close reefed top sails and foresail and steered by the wind to the South  
Lat by Obs 20.22 Long by Chro 172.01
