

Sunday July 13th 1862

Comes with light air and Calm at 1 P.M. saw Breaches to the W. headed the ship for them saw them no more at dark light air from the S.E. steering S.W. middle and latter part fresh breeze varying from E.S.E. to S working to the S under all sail at daylight Round Island 9 miles distant a number of Islands in sight

Lat by Obs 16.58 Long by Chron 177.22 E

Monday July 14th 1862

Comes with light air and Baffling working to the S middle and latter part fresh breeze from the Southward plenty of land in sight steering by the wind to the S.W. and west by N

Tuesday July 15th 1862

Comes with a fresh breeze from the S and fine weather steering by the wind to the S.W. middle part strong breeze from the S.E. latter part from the E steering by the wind to the Southward

Lat by Obs 16.03 Long by Chron 175.57

Wednesday July 16th 1862

Commences with strong wind from the E and good weather steering by the wind to the S.E. at 3 P.M. double reefed Top Sails middle and latter part strong wind from the Eastward and good weather at 10 P.M. Took in main sail at midnight wore ship to the S.E. at 10 A.M. wore ship to the S.E. by S. a bad sea running

Lat by Obs 16.17 Long by Chron 176.12

Thursday July 17th 1862

Comes with a strong breeze from the E and cloudy steering by the wind to the S.E. with double reefed Top Sails set middle and latter part more moderate at midnight set whole topsails and main Top got lantard at 7 P.M. ship to the S.E.

Lat by Obs 17.27 Long 176.36

Friday July 18th 1862

Commences with a fresh breeze from the E and good weather steering by the wind to the S.E. at 2 P.M. tacked to the S.E. middle and latter part wind and weather much the same at 11 P.M. tacked ship to the S at 8 P.M. tacked to the S.E. at 4 to the S again working to the Eastward

Lat by Obs 17.33 Long by Chron 177.36

Saturday July 19th 1862

Comes with strong winds from the E.S.E. and Cloudy steering by the wind to the S at 2 P.M. double reefed Top Sails at 4 wore ship to the S.E. at 10 P.M. took in Jib and mainsail at 1 M. set them again at 4 set whole Top Sails at 5 A.M. tacked to the S at 9 A.M. saw the Island Rarotonga at 30 miles dist at meridian West end at 5 miles

Sunday July 20th 1862

Comes with strong winds from the S.E. and good weather steering by the wind to the S at 2 P.M. double reefed Top Sails and took in main Sails at 5 wore ship to the S.E. at dark the land S.E. 10 miles distant middle and latter part strong winds at daylight stood in for the and halled aback a boat came off from the Shore and said we could get nothing to day hoisted forward and stood off Shore at meridian land 20 miles dist

Lat by Obs 18.51 Long by Chron 178.09

Monday July 21st 1862

Comes with strong winds from the E and fine weather heading to the S under double reefed Top Sails at 3 wore ship to the S at dark wore ship and lay aback to the S the land 5 miles distant middle and latter part strong winds and fine weather at daylight stood in for the land at 9 A.M. sent 2 boats ashore at harbor to trade at meridian the boats on shore took one Boat load of Yams On Board so ended the day
