

Thursday July 31st 1862

First part light airs and calms ship heading to all Points of compass employed Hoisting at dark dead calm at midnight light breeze from the N steering NE latter part moderate breeze from the S with fine weather at 11 AM finished boiling the two whales turned up 86 bls

Friday August 1st 1862

Commences with moderate breeze from the N and fine weather steering S by N at 2 PM saw a merchant ship steering to the SE at dark halled on the wind to the SSW middle part squally latter part light breeze from the S steering by the wind to the westward employed coopering Oil

Lat by Obs 24.47 Long by Chron 172.11

Saturday Aug 2^d 1862

Comes with light air from the S and fine weather steering by the wind to the westward employed coopering Oil to stow middle part calm latter part light breeze from the SE and fine weather steering SSW with all sail set employed stoving Oil between decks

Lat by Obs 24.29 Long by Chron 171.57

Sunday Aug 3^d 1862

Commences with a light breeze from the SE and fine weather steering SSW at 4 PM finished stoving Oil and washed the deck stowed down 86 bls Sperm Oil at 6 PM steered N by N middle part strong breeze took in top gallant sails latter part fresh Gale from the SE and hazy at 9 AM double reefed the Topsails steering S by S

Monday Aug 4th 1862

Commences with fresh gales from the SE and hazy steering SSW at 4 PM lay the ship to under storm Gails to the N middle and latter part squally with rain lying under storm sails to the Westward

Tuesday August 5th 1862

Commences with moderate winds from the W and rainy at 3 PM set double reefed topsails and steered by the wind to the SSW middle part strong winds latter part fresh Gale at 8 took in the fore and Mizzen Top Gails ship heading to the S

Lat by Obs 25.56 Long by Chron 169.38

Wednesday August 6th 1862

Comes with fresh gales from the N with heavy squalls lying under storm Gails to the S middle part the same latter part strong winds from the S and good weather at 10 AM the fore and Mizzen topsails double reefed and steered by the wind to the S

Lat by Obs 26.28 Long by Chron 169.17

Thursday August 7th 1862

Commences with strong wind from the S and good weather steering by the wind to the S with double reefed top sails set a heavy sea running middle part light airs set whole topsails and main top gallant sail latter part strong winds from the SE and good weather steering by the wind to the Westward at 8 AM took in main Top Gallant Sail at 9 double reefed the Top Sails

Lat by Obs 27.19 Long by Chron 169.15

Friday August 8th 1862

Commences with a fresh Gale from the SE and squally steering by the wind to the westward at 4 PM took in top and spanker at 6 squally with rain wind halled to the SSW heading SSW middle and latter part strong winds and squally with rain at 7 AM took in fore and Mizzen Topsail and wore ship to the SE fresh Gale with rain

Saturday August 9th 1862

Comes with strong winds with squally weather heading to the SE under storm Gails wind from the SE middle part more moderate at midnight wore ship to the S and set double reefed Top Sails latter part strong Gale at 8 AM wore ship to the SE and lay under storm Gails
