

Friday October 3rd 1862

Commenced with a strong wind from the S.E. and squally steering S.E. at 3 P.M. halled on the wind to the S.W. one ship in sight at sundown took in sail for the night middle and latter part moderate wind from the S.E. and cloudy at daylight set all sail and steered to the E. at 8 A.M. saw whales lored 4 Boats and chased untill noon came on Board and got dinner and lored three Boats. two sail in sight

Lat By Obs 37.15 Long By Chro 152.65

Saturday October 4th 1862

Commences with moderate breeze from the S.W. and blowing three Boats in chase of whales at 8 struck and killed one at 4 took him to the Ship at 5 commenced to cut at 9 finished cutting and took in sail middle and latter part light air from the S.W. and fine weather at daylight set all sail and headed to the S.E. two sail in sight at 7 commenced to Boil

Sunday October 5th 1862

Commences with calm employed in Boiling two sail in sight middle part moderate breeze from the S.W. Latter part fresh winds from the W. at dark finished Boiling and took in sail at daylight set whole topsails and main topgallant sail at 8 lored for a whale at meridian Boats in chase of a whale

Lat By Obs 37.53 Long By Chro 151.52

Monday October 6th 1862

Commences with a moderate breeze from the S.W. and fine weather the Boats in chase of a whale could not get fast at 1 P.M. took the Boats up at dark finished Boiling and took in sail and spoke the *Wm. Gifford* with one Whale this season middle part fresh breeze latter part strong breeze from the West at daylight set whole topsails and steered different courses at 7 commenced to break out the main hatch way to stern Oil two sail in sight

Lat By Obs 37.58 Long By Chro 152.89

Tuesday October 7th 1862

Commences with a strong wind from the W. and fine weather steering different courses at dark finished stowing stowee down 82 lbs and took in sail for the night and halled on the wind to the S.W. middle and latter part fresh breeze from the S.W. and good weather at daylight set all sail and steered S by E. at 8 A.M. saw a whale lored four Boats at meridian the Boats in chase of the whale

Lat By Obs 37.15 Long By Chro 152.65

Wednesday October 8th 1862

Commences with light breeze from the S.W. and cloudy the Boats in chase of a whale at 2 P.M. took the Boats up at dark light air from the S.E. took in sail for the night three sail in sight middle and latter part light baffling air at daylight set all sail at 7 lored 3 Boats for whales at 11 A.M. struck and killed one at 12 A.M. took him to the Ship with a light breeze from the S.W. and got ready to cut

Lat By Obs 37.07 Long By Chro 152.13

Thursday October 9th 1862

Comes with a fresh breeze from the S.W. and cloudy at 1 P.M. commenced to cut at 5 finished blowing a fresh gale took all but storm sails and cleared up the deck saw the *James Allen* take a whale middle part fresh Gale from the S.W. and squally with rain latter part moderate gale and squally at 8 commenced to boil one sail in sight

Lat By Obs 37.00 Long By Chro 152.55

Friday October 10th 1862

Commences with fresh gale from the S.W. and squally laying with double reefed main top sail and fore sail set. Boiling at 5 P.M. wore ship to the W. a sail in sight to the W. middle part fresh gales from the S.W. latter part the same at 8 A.M. wore ship to S.E. and set double reefed top sails employed Boiling the *Bark James Allen* in sight boiling
