

Wednesday October 29th 1862
 Commences with light breeze from the E and squally at 3 P.M.
 wind from the S.W. and clear bore 2 Boats for a whale without
 success at 6 strong winds from the W took in sail for the night
 heading to the S.W. employed Boiling middle and latter part
 moderate Gales from the S.W. and squally heading by the wind
 on the western tack with double reefed main Top Sail and Foresail
 boiling at 5 A.M. saw a merchant ship steering S.W.
 Lat By Obs 38.21

Thursday October 30th 1862
 Comes with moderate Gales from the S.W. with squally misty
 weather laying to the W under double reefed main Top sail and
 Foresail at 2 P.M. finished boiling at 5 wore ship to the S.E.
 middle part more moderate with light squalls of rain latter part fresh
 breeze from the S and good weather at daylight set double reefed Top Sails
 and steered by the wind to the S.E. at 9 A.M. set whole top Sails and main
 Sail at 11 A.M. wore ship to the S.W. employed stowing Oil in the
 after hold one ship in sight
 Lat By Obs 38.28 Long By Chro 153.21

Friday October 31st 1862
 Comes with light breeze from the S and fine weather steering by
 the wind to the S.W. employed stowing Oil stowed 80 bbls the Boat
 from Gifford in sight at dark took in sail for the night middle
 and latter part moderate breeze from the S at daylight set whole
 top sail at 9 wore ship and steered by the wind to the E
 Lat by Obs 38.38 Long By Chro 153.31

Saturday November 1st 1862
 Commences with fresh breeze from the S and cloudy steering
 by the wind to the E at dark wind from the S.W. took in sail
 for the night heading S.E. middle and latter part strong
 wind and cloudy at daylight set double reefed Top Sails
 at 9 A.M. set all sail and steered S.W. at 10 sent a boat
 to the S.E. steering to the west
 Lat By Obs 38.35 Long By Chro 153.41

Sunday October 31st 1862
 Comes with a strong wind from the S and cloudy steering S.W.
 with all sail set at 4 P.M. spoke the Wm Gifford at dark took
 in sail and headed to the S.E. middle part fresh gales from the
 S.W. with squalls of rain at daylight wore ship to the W and took
 in the Fore Sail and close reefed the main Top Sail latter part
 strong gales and rainy and thick with heavy sea
 No Obs

Monday November 3rd 1862
 Commences with strong Gales from S.W. and squally heading
 to the W at 6 P.M. took in main Top Sail middle and latter part
 fresh gales at 6 A.M. set main topsail and Foresail heading
 to the S.E. a heavy sea running
 Lat By Obs 38.40 Long By Chro 154.58

Tuesday November 4th 1862
 Commences with fresh Gales from the S.W. and squally
 heading to the S.E. with close reefed main Top sail and Fore
 Sail set at dark wore ship to the S.W. and took in Foresail
 middle part squally latter part more moderate at daylight
 set the Foresail and wore ship to the S.E. wind from the S.W.
 at 8 A.M. set double reefed Top sails at 11 set whole Top Sails
 One Ship in sight and plenty Pinbacks
 Lat by Obs 38.48 Long By Chro 155.37

Wednesday November 5th 1862
 Commences with strong wind from the S.W. and cloudy
 steering by the wind to the S.E. with whole top Sails set
 at 2 P.M. Signalized One of Penarth Boats Ships could not
 tell what ship at 6 P.M. squally took in sail for the night
 two sail in sight wore ship to the S.W. middle and
 latter part strong wind and squally at daylight set double
 reefed Top Sails and wore ship to the S at 8 set whole
 Top Sails saw several Pinbacks
 Lat By Obs 38.45 Long By Chro 155.25
