Comes with strong winds from the W and cloudy steering by the wind to the S W with double reefed Pop Gails set at dark took in sail middle and latter part fresh Gale at 6 A.M. set double reefed Pop Gails and steered by the wind to the S wind from the W the Illinois in sight

Wednesday Nov 26th 1862

Commences with strong winds from the S W and clear steering by the wind to the S E at 7 P.M. took in sail middle and latter part strong winds from the S W and clear at daylight set double reefed Pop Gails and steered S E the Illinois in company

Thursday November 27th 1862

Commences with a strong wind from the S W and clear weather steering S E with whole main Pop Sail and main Pop Gallant sail at 4 P.M. spoke the Illinois went on Board at 7 took in sail for the night middle part strong wind at 5 A.M. set double reefs and steered by the wind to the S E at 8 steered S E by S at 9 spoke the ship Illinois went on Board and dined from roast turkey and spent 5 hours very pleasantly with capt Patten and Lady

Friday November 28th 1862

Commences with fresh Gale from the S W and cloudy at 2 P.M. came on Board at 3 took in fore and mizzen top sails at 6 took in foresail and close reefed the main top sail blowing hard with heavy sea middle and latter part strong Gales latter part rainy

Saturday November 29th 1862

Comes with strong winds from the S W with rain laying under close reefed Pop Gail to the S E at 3 P.M. light baffling wind with much rain middle part wind halled to the S E latter part fresh breeze from the S E and cloudy at daylight set all sail and steered by the wind to the S W

Sunday November 30th 1862

Comes with a strong breeze from the S and cloudy steering by the wind to the S W with all sail set at 7 P.M. took in sail for the night middle and latter part strong wind from the S E and cloudy at daylight set whole Pop Gails and steered by the wind to the S W saw nothing this day

Lat By Obs 44.25 Long By Chro 159.41

Monday December 1st 1862

Commences with a strong wind from the S E and cloudy at 1 P.M. wore ship to the S E at 3 double reefed the Pop Gails at 6 took in fore and mizzen Pop Gails and foresail at 5 P.M. saw a steamer steering to the westward middle part fresh gale latter part strong Gale with thick rainy weather laying under storm sails at 5 P.M. wore ship to the S W

Tuesday December 2nd 1862

Commences with strong Gale from the S E thick and rainy laying under storm sails to the S W middle part more moderate wind halled to the S E latter part moderate breeze and fine at daylight set all sail and steered by the wind to the S E saw nothing this day

Lat By Obs 44.20 Long By Chro 160.00

Wednesday December 3rd 1862

Comes with a fresh breeze from the S E with large sea steering by the wind to the S E at 4 took ship to the S W middle part thick and rainy steering by the wind to the S at midnight double reefed the fore and mizzen Pop Gails latter part light breeze from the S and hazy steering S E a bark in sight to the S

Thursday December 4th 1862

Comes with moderate breeze from the S and clear steering S E a bark in sight at 4 P.M. spoke the Bark of Robert Brown Capt Sanderson 11 months 2003 tons middle and latter part strong breeze from the S W steering by the wind to the S W
