

Journal of a whaling voyage in the good Barque

98. Thursday Feb 3rd 1852.
Commenced with fresh breezes from N. heading N.W. a Bark in sight standing the N.E. at 4 P.M. finished, brising. Middlepart fine weather. Scatterpart the same heading N.E. So ends. Come S.E. S. Sat 35. 37. S. Long 49. 46. W.

99. Friday Feb 6th.
Commenced with fine breezes from N.E. heading N.W. at dark, took in sail. Middlepart fresh breezes. Scatterpart the same. Employed in stowing down oil. So ends. Come S.E. S.

100. Saturday Feb 7th.
Commenced with fine weather. Heading to the westward. Employed in breaking out between decks at 6 P.M. Took the Barque *Immanuel* of New York. Wing master. Smiths out 226 lbs of sperm oil. Middlepart fresh breezes. Scatterpart more moderate. employed in stowing down oil. two Bks in sight. So ends. Come S.E. S.

101. Sunday Feb 8th.
Commenced with moderate winds and fine weather employed in washing off the decks. At sunset took in sail. Middlepart pleasant. Scatterpart squally with rain thunder and lightning. Saw a Brig sailing N.E. So ends. Come S.E. S.

102. Monday Feb 9th.
Commenced with fresh breezes from N.E. heading N.W. at sunset took in sail. Middlepart fresh breezes. Scatterpart the same. Employed in setting up shrouds and repairing the larboard. So ends. Come S.E. S.

Sat 35. 21. S.

Long 51. 18. W.

Atlantic. cruising off the River Rio de la Plata.

103. Tuesday Feb 10th 1852.
Commenced with fresh breezes from N. heading N.W. at sunset took in sail. Middlepart thunder and lightning at 10 P.M. fresh gales from S took in the main topsail. Scatterpart fresh gales and clear weather. wind shifted to the W. were ship to the S. So ends. Sat 36. 14. S. Long 53. 10. W. Come S.E. S.

104. Wednesday Feb 11th.
Commenced with fresh gales from N.W. heading N.E. at 4 P.M. more moderate. Took close reefed main topsail. Middlepart moderate wind shifted to the S. were ship to the Eastward. Scatterpart fresh gales and clear weather. So ends. Come S.E. S.

105. Thursday Feb 12th.
Commenced with fresh gales from N. heading E.S.E. under short sail. Middlepart strong breezes. Scatterpart more moderate, were ship to the westward. nothing in sight. Sat 36. 30. S. Long 50. 56. W. Come S.E. S.

106. Friday Feb 13th.
Commenced with fresh breezes from N. heading N.W. Middlepart fresh breezes. Scatterpart the same heading N. Sat 36. 21. S. Long 50. 01. W. Come S.E. S.

107. Saturday Feb 14th.
Commenced with moderate and fine weather. Sent down the fore top gallant mast. Saw lots of bird on the water. Middlepart strong breezes. At 11 P.M. took in the fore sails fore topsail and close reefed the main, luffed to the wind heading E.S.E. Scatterpart strong breezes, at 11 P.M. let the fore sail and kept off N.E. So ends. Come S.E. S.

Long 53. 30. W.
