

Journal of a whaling voyage on board the good,

312. Monday Sept 6th 1852.
Commenced with fine weather the larboard watch on liberty at dark returned. Middlepart pleasant. Batterpart the same. Employed in getting off water and setting up hooks. So ends. (Home Sides.)

313. Tuesday Sept 7th.
Commenced with pleasant weather. Employed in stowing water. At 4 P.M. let go the starboard anchor. Middlepart wind N.E. and rainy equally weather. Batterpart the same. So ends. (Home Sides.)

314. Wednesday Sept 8th.
Commenced with fresh breezes from N.E. and equally got off a raft of water. Middlepart pleasant. Batterpart the same. Look on board our recruits of onions, potatoes, cabbages, and pumpkins. (The starboard watch on liberty. So ends. (Home Sides.)

315. Thursday Sept 9th.
Commenced with pleasant weather the starboard watch on liberty at dark returned. Middlepart pleasant. Batterpart the same. The larboard watch on liberty. So ends. (Home Sides.)

316. Friday Sept 10th.
Commenced with fine weather the larboard watch on liberty at dark returned. Middlepart strong breezes. Batterpart rainy. The starboard watch on liberty. So ends. (Home Sides.)

Discharged the Carpenter, Cook, and Black Smith on account of sickness. Shipped two Portuguese and an American in their stead. George Enckham, Ensign Barnes, Thomas Conry, and Wm. Spooner deserted.

Bark Atlantic.

317. Saturday Sept 11th 1852.
Commenced with fine weather. The starboard watch on liberty at dark returned. Middlepart pleasant. Batterpart the same. At 9 A.M. got underway and stood out into the passage. Employed in stowing chains and anchors. The Capt went on shore to look for deserters. So ends. (Home Sides.)

318. Sunday Sept 12th.
Commenced with fine weather. Lying off and on at 3 P.M. the Capt came on board (could find none of the deserters) started out of the passage to the eastward. at 5 P.M. spoke the Chamber of N.B. clean. at sunset took in sail. Middlepart moderate. Batterpart the same. So ends. (Home Sides.)

319. Monday Sept 13th.
Commenced with light breezes heading in for Graciosa. 3 sails in sight at dark took in sail. Middlepart moderate. Batterpart the same heading in for Graciosa. At 11 P.M. spoke the Pico, Fayal and 3 sails in sight. So ends. (Home Sides.)

320. Tuesday Sept 14th.
Commenced with fresh breezes and rainy weather at 3 P.M. shortened sail. at 5 P.M. clear weather. Fayal, Pico, and 1 ship in sight. Middlepart strong breezes. Batterpart the same sent up the St. B. S. yard. Spoke the Bk. Sea Hog of Westport. So ends. (Home Sides.)
