

Journal of a whaling voyage on board the good

321.

Wednesday Sept 15th 1852.

Commenced with fresh breezes from the S. heading in for the islands. Pico, Fayal, St George and St. Paul in sight. At sunset took in sail and were ship off shore. Middlepart fresh breezes. Scatterpart equally. were ship to the S.E. At 12 A.M. saw Fayal bearing E distant 20 mls. 3 sails in sight. So ends. Home Side.

322.

Thursday Sept 16th.

Commenced with fresh breezes from W.W. heading for Fayal 3 ships in sight. at 3 P.M. were ship off shore Fayal bearing N.E. distant 4 mls. 1000 in the jib, mainmast and double reefed the main topsail. Middlepart fresh breezes. Scatterpart the same. ran down and hove to off Fayal. The Capt went on shore after runaways. Home Side.

323.

Friday Sept 17th.

Commenced with fresh breezes from S. and equally weather lying off and on at 4 P.M. wind shifted to the E. at 6 P.M. the Capt came on board without the deisters. At 8 P.M. strong winds took in the fore topsail close reefed the main and reefed the fore sail. Middlepart fresh gales. Scatterpart the same at close reefed topsails and courses beating up towards Fayal. So ends. Home Side.

324.

Saturday Sept 18th.

Commenced with strong breezes from E.N.E. at 2 P.M. hove to off Fayal. The Capt went on shore at dark returned and steered out of the passage and hove to under the lee of the land. Middlepart pleasant. Scatterpart the same steered N.W.W. 3 sails in sight. So ends. Home Side.

Sunday Sept 19th 1852.

Commenced with fresh breezes from N.E. and pleasant heading heading N.W.W. Fayal in sight. Middlepart pleasant. Scatterpart the same. Fayal, St George and St. Paul in sight. So ends. Home Side.

326.

Monday Sept 20th.

Commenced with fresh breezes from N.E. heading S.E. Steered in for Fayal at 3 P.M. tacked off shore at dark Fayal bore N.E. by S distant 15 mls. Middlepart fresh breezes. Scatterpart the same ran down off Fayal at 11 A.M. the Capt went on shore.

327.

Tuesday Sept 21st.

Commenced with fresh breezes lying off and on at 2 1/2 P.M. the Capt returned without the runaways. Steered to the S. at sunset took in sail. Middlepart equally. Scatterpart fresh breezes with equally weather. Fayal, Pico, St George, Terceira and 1000 in sight. So ends. Home Side.

328.

Wednesday Sept 22nd.

Commenced with fresh breezes from E heading in for Pico. at sunset took in sail and tacked off shore. Middlepart fresh breezes. at 3 A.M. were to the eastward. Scatterpart fresh breezes from E. heading in between St George and Terceira. So ends. Home Side.

329.

Thursday Sept 23rd.

Commenced with fresh breezes from N.E. ran through between St George, Terceira and Graciosa. 3 ships in sight at dark Graciosa bore W.W. distant 15 mls. St George bore W distant 40 mls. Graciosa bore N.W. by W distant 30 mls. Middlepart fresh breezes. Scatterpart the same steered off for Graciosa. Employed in breaking out for bread and sending up Main Royal. 3 sails in sight. So ends. Home Side.
