

Journal of a whaling voyage on board the good

330. Friday Sept 24th 1852.
Commences with fine breezes from N. heading in for Graciosa at 4 P.M. the town bore N.W. distant 2 miles at sunset took in sail and hove to heading for St George. Middlepart fresh breezes Scatterpart squally passed St George distant 2 miles. Stared over towards Gayal. Several sails in sight. So ends

331. Saturday Sept 25th.
Commences with fresh breezes from N.W. and squally with thunder and lightning. took in the main sail jib and Hauler and double reefed the topsails. At 6 P.M. exchanged signals with a whaling bark and spoke B.M. Catharine Allen of N.B. 4 months out of 30 days out of 30 days. Middlepart moderate Scatterpart light airs and calm Gayal in sight distant 20 miles. So ends

332. Sunday Sept 26th.
Commences with light breezes from W heading for Gayal at 5 P.M. lowered the boat and landed the 10 just from Gayal bound to Boston at sunset took in sail. Middlepart moderate. Scatterpart the same spoke the Brig Ethel of Truro 6 months out clean.

333. Monday Sept 27th.
Commences with moderate breezes from E. landed the mate in the back side of Gayal to look for deserters. Saw an American ship going into Gayal. Middlepart fresh breezes double reefed the topsails. Scatterpart moderate and variable. heading in for Gayal. So ends.

Bark Atlantic:

334. Tuesday Sept 28th 1852.
Commences with fine weather lying off and on at Gayal. The boat went on shore after deserters and returned with one the only one that he wanted Middlepart pleasant. Scatterpart the same steering N.W. Gayal, P.M. St George and 2 sails in sight. So ends

335. Wednesday Sept 29th.
Commences with moderate breezes from N.W. heading E. 2 sails in sight. Middlepart fresh breezes took in light sails Scatterpart the same with thick weather at 11 A.M. double reefed the topsails saw a merchant brig steering N.W. and a ship steering N.E. so ends St Michaels bearing E.N.E. distant 20 miles.

336. Thursday Sept 30th.
Commences with strong breezes from N.W. heading E. at 2 P.M. fresh gales took in sail. Middlepart strong gales. Scatterpart fresh breezes steering N.W. 2 sails in sight. St George bearing N.W. distant 10 miles.

337. Friday Sept Oct 1st.
Commences with fresh breezes from N.W. steering N.W. at sunset took in sail. 1 sail in sight. Middlepart pleasant Scatterpart cloudy steering N.W. Employed in breaking out the after hold for beef, pork and butter. So ends

338. Saturday Oct 2nd.
Commences with fresh breezes from E. steering N.W. at dark furled the jib and hauled up the main sail. Middlepart fine weather. Scatterpart light breezes. Employed in various jobs. 2 sails in sight. So ends.
