367. Sunday Oct 31st. 1852.
Commences with pleasant weather and fresh trades from N.E. heading N.W. at 1/2 P.M. Exchanged signals with the ship Orissa of Boston. Steering N.W. Middlepart fresh trades. Batterpart the same heading N.W. by W. 20 miles. A year ago to day sailed from the Port of New Bedford. Home Side.
Lat 7.37. S. Dist 237. mls. Long 27.30. W.

368. Monday Nov 1st.
Commences with fine trades from N.E. heading N.W. Middlepart pleasant. Batterpart light trades from E.S.E. Steering N.W. by W. Employed in middlesticking fore-trail. 20 miles. Home Side.
Lat 9.38. S. Dist 166.

369. Tuesday Nov 2nd.
Commences with fine weather and pleasant trades from E.N.E. Steering N.W. by W. Employed in middlesticking fore-trail and starting fresh water at 4 P.M. Took the waist boat in on deck. Saw a ship steering N. Middlepart pleasant. Batterpart fine trades from N.E. Steering N.W. by W. Employed in turning up 20 mizen rigging and mauling over the waist boat. 20 miles. Home Side.
Lat 11.11. S. Dist 131. mls. Long 25.30. W.

370. Wednesday Nov 3rd.
Commences with light trades from N.E. and rain Steering N.W. by W. Sail in sight. Middlepart fine trades. Batterpart the same Steering N.W. by W. Employed in fitting cutting fall blockstrops. 20 miles.
Lat 12.30. S. Dist 144. mls. Long 27.10. W.

371. Thursday Nov 4th. 1852.
Commences with fine trades from N.E. Steering N.W. by W. Employed in turning up Starboard mizen rigging. Middlepart pleasant. Batterpart fine trades Steering N.W. Employed in middlesticking the fore-sail. 20 miles.
Lat 14.56. S. Dist 168. mls. Long 25.56. W. Home Side.

372. Friday Nov 5th.
Commences with fine trades from N.E. and rain Steering N.W. Employed in middlesticking the fore-sail. Middlepart variable with thunder and lightning. Batterpart pleasant. Saw jammers. 20 miles. Home Side.
Lat 16.56. S. Dist 158. mls. Long 27.24. W.

373. Saturday Nov 6th.
Commences with fresh trades from N.E. Steering N.W. Saw grampuses. Employed in ships duty. Middlepart pleasant. Batterpart light trades. Steering N.W. at 6. A. M. Spoke a French brig heading on the wind with her Starboard tack aboard. Employed in filling a spare boat. Sail in sight. 20 miles. Home Side.
Lat 18.35. S. Dist 121. mls. Long 28.54. W.

374. Sunday Nov 7th.
Commences with fine weather Steering N.W. Employed in ships duty. at 2 P.M. Spoke a fish boat of dark from the Regus got a mess of fish from her. Several other boats in sight. Saw hump backs. Middlepart pleasant. Batterpart the same. Steering N.W. Saw a ship heading on the wind with her Starboard tack aboard. 20 miles.
Lat 20.30. S. Dist Long 29.19. W. Home Side.
