

Commenced with fine weather and calm. Employed in boiling oil. At 1 P.M. finished and washed off. At sunset took in sail. Middleport squally and rainy with thunder and lightning. Battapart fair weather at 7 P.M. made hit. At 10 P.M. spoke a Spanish Brig 5 days from Buenos Ayres bound to Liverpool.

Sat. 26. 27. 1. Long 53. 53. 9.

847. Sunday Feb 26th 1854. Home Side. Commenced with fresh breezes heading N.W. at 6 P.M. took in sail and wore ship. Middleport fresh breezes Battapart pleasant and calm. Camp in stowing down oil.

Sat. 26. 39. 0. Long 53. 37. 9.

848. Monday Feb 27th. Commenced with fine breezes heading E. Employed in stowing down oil at 2 P.M. finished and washed off. At sunset took in sail. Middleport rainy and squally with thunder and lightning. Battapart the same. Under short sail.

849. Tuesday Feb 28th. Commenced with rain squally weather under short sail. Middleport fresh gales heading N.W. Battapart strong breezes steering N.E. by E.

Sat. 27. 23. 1. Long 53. 46. 9.

850. Wednesday March 1st. Home Side. Commenced with strong breezes from E steering N.W. Employed in repairing fore topmast stay sail. Caught a porpoise. At sunset took in sail. Middleport pleasant. Battapart the same and fine breezes steering Eastward. Camp in breaking out between decks. At meridian spoke ship Emma C. Gones 2 or 3 days from and 5 or 6 of whale oil since we parted.

Sat. 26. 44. 1. Long 53. 46. 9.

851. Thursday March 2nd. Home Side. Commenced with fine weather and moderate steering N. in company with E.C. at sunset took in sail. Middleport pleasant. Battapart the same heading N. in company with the Emma C.

Sat. 26. 53. 1. Long 53. 53. 9.

Commenced with fine weather and light breezes from N.W. heading N. in company with the Emma C. at sunset took in sail. Middleport fine weather and moderate. Battapart the same. E.C. in sight.

Sat. 26. 55. 1. Long 54. 27. 9.

852. Saturday March 4th. Home Side. Commenced with fine weather and calm. E.C. in sight at sunset took in sail. Middleport calm. Battapart strong breezes steering N. double reefed. Topsails. Sat. 26. 55. 1. Long 54. 11. 9.

854. Sunday March 5th. Home Side. Commenced with strong breezes from N.W. steering N.W. at 3 P.M. luffed to the wind under close reefed main topsail heading N.E. by E. Emma in sight. Middleport fresh gales. Carried away the after davit of the boat boat. Battapart strong breezes and squally heading N. Employed in repairing said davit. Caught 3 porpoises.

855. Monday 6th. Home Side. Commenced with strong breezes and squally heading E.C. at sunset took in sail. Middleport very moderate. Battapart fine weather and light breezes heading N.W.

Sat. 28. 51. 1. Long 53. 05. 9. Home Side. 53. 38. 9. 856. Tuesday 7th. Commenced with fine weather and light breezes from N.W. heading N.W. E.C. in sight. At sunset took in sail. Middleport pleasant. Battapart the same heading E.C. Caught 3 porpoises.

Sat. 28. 30. 1. Long 53. 15. 9. 857. Wednesday 8th. Commenced with fine weather and breezes from N.W. heading E.C. at 3 P.M. took in ship. At 4 P.M. spoke Emma C. at sunset took in sail. Middleport fresh breezes. Battapart strong breezes. Course variable. E.C. in sight.
