2 S W S by E commence with a light air and pleasant
4 East S by E tacked ship at 4 and night tacked again
6 Latter part a light air ship by the
8 wind all sail set and the crew employed
10 in braking out the fore & after masts
12 Stow down forward 15 bbls of Beef 4 bbls of Pork
2 in order to trim the ship by the head
4 thus end

2 S W S by E commence with pleasant weather light air
4 and calm at 4 some squalls of rain
6 saw black fish 9 am chase with one
8 boat but with out success. Mid part
10 as above Latter part a light air ship by
12 the wind with her starboard tack on board
2 the watch employed at various jobs
4 about the ship

12 beautiful day the weather rather more pleasant
2 but no prospect of a breeze

12 to the north
