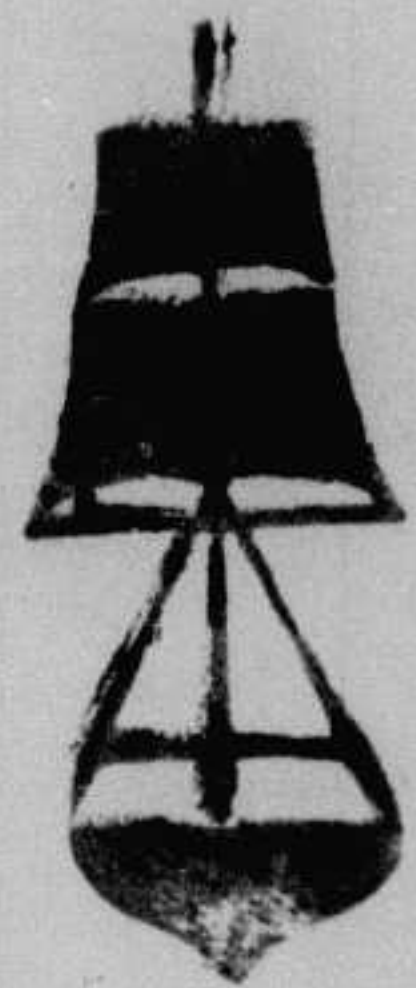


Ship Nimrod off of the Island of Hawaii



Remarks on board Tuesday April 24th 1844

Commence with pleasant weather & calm the
Land about 15 miles off, Employed in varnishing the
Mast and Rigging a light breeze from N.E. & W. and
cloudy with frequent rain. Ship working to the windward
towards the Entrance of Lahaina Port. Had Part
a moderate breeze and thick hazy weather most of the
time. At 10 AM. Shaved up saw the land
had altered the bearing of the land about one point
thus End, a head wind a strong current
against us. Saw a ship to the windward
about 10 miles.

Lat by Day 20° 53'

Remarks on board Wednesday April 25th

First commencement a moderate breeze
& fair weather. Ship with all sail set
working to the windward with the wind
from N.W. to N.E. with a strong
current against us. At dark the Entrance
of said Port bearing per compass about
N by N about 15 miles distant. Wind Part
as above, latter to a moderate breeze from
the North and pleasant Ship steering N. for
the passage between the Island of Hawaii & Oahu
thus Ends.

Remarks on board Thursday 26th of April

Commence with pleasant weather and a
moderate breeze from N.E. Ship steering N.
with standing sail set at 7 AM. Came to
Anchor at the port of Lahaina in 15 fathoms
of water. Latter part fine weather all hands
Employed sent a raft on shore for water.
Landed eleven pipes of Bread got off 54 bbls of
Irish potatoes &c thus Ends.

Remarks on board Friday April 27th 1844

This Day pleasant weather all hands Employed in getting off
Water & Stowing it away. Stowed down 158 bbls. sent a water
Raft on shore thus Ends.

Saturday April 28th

First part moderate
latter part strong breeze got off a raft of water
the water on shore. The other water Employed in
painting the Ship thus Ends.

Sunday April 29th

This Day fine weather in a fresh breeze the water
on shore on liberty thus Ends.

Monday April 30th

This Day pleasant weather the water on shore
the water on board Employed in painting Ship
thus Ends. The Barque Massachusetts of Balmouth
came in 6 months from home with 200000 Spruce Oil.

Tuesday April 30th

May 1st 1844
This Day pleasant & moderate the water
on liberty the water on board Employed
in painting the Masts & Stowing away Water
Stowed down 67 bbls. thus Ends.

Remarks on board Wednesday May 2nd

This Day pleasant and light in the water
on shore the water on board Employed at various
jobs painting some &c thus Ends.

Thursday May 3rd

This Day pleasant & moderate the water on shore
the water on board variously Employed
got off three pipes of Water thus Ends. Discharged
our Blacksmith.
