

Ship Nimrod A. cruising for Whales Near the coast

Remarks on board Saturday June 16th 1849
Commenced with thick fog and a moderate breeze from S.E. at 10 AM. Double reefed topsails on the ship heading S.E. by the wind a heavy swell on the water & rather light air and calm a thick fog then S.E. by S.

Remarks on board Sunday June 17th

Commenced with light air from the North ship under easy sail heading to the Eastward a thick fog. Mid Part & near calm. Rather light weather moderate breeze from the N.E. at 6 AM. were ship and ship heading S.E. by S. Double reefed topsails set. Mid Part & ship.

Remarks on board Monday June 18th

Commenced with thick foggy weather and a moderate breeze from N.E. ship heading S.E. by E with double reefed topsails set at 3 AM. took in fore & main topsails. Mid Part lying under close reefed main topsail & fore sail. Rather Part a gale of wind from N.E. ship under the above sail heading S.E. by E this End N.E.

Remarks on board Tuesday June 19th

Commenced a gale of wind from N.E. & thick weather ship under close reefed main topsail & fore sail heading S.E. by E at 6 PM. took in the fore sail. Mid Part more moderate. Rather Part a strong breeze & fair weather set double reefed topsails on ship by the wind heading S.E.

Remarks on board Wednesday June 20th

Commenced with a fresh breeze from N.E. ship with double reefed topsails set. Heading a buoy W.S.W. saw a number of fin backs. Mid Part lying under double reefed main topsail & fore sail heading S.E. by the wind. Rather Part light air & calm the weather hazy then End.

Remarks on board Thursday June 21st

Commenced with fair weather & calm. Mid Part & rather calm and thick fog then End.
