 lying under easy sail heading S.W. by S. a moderate breeze

 near the ship. Latter Part, light air from the Eastward
 and a thick fog. Ship steering W.W. Main top gallant
 sail set. thus End. the fog cleared away some.

Remarks on board Tuesday July 3rd
 Commenced a thick fog and light air from
 S to S.W. Ship steering W.W. Main top gallant sail
 set. at 6 P.M. took in sail. heard the ship off
 shore. Judge the land to be 40 miles distant.
 Main Part, under easy sail heading S.W.
 Latter Part, fair weather a fresh breeze from S.W.
 at 4 P.M. made sail set. the topsails & Main
 top gallant sail. Ship heading S.W. by the wind
 at 2 P.M. kept her off. W by S. with fore topmast
 standing thus End.
