

Ship Nimrod Near The Sandwich Islands 1849

HKF Course Wind & Remarks on board Friday Oct 26th

2 S. P. Calt commenced with a fresh breeze and
4 pleasant weather ship with all sail
6 set steering a buoy N. by E. and
8 latter a strong breeze employed in painting
10 some ends. Bore dependent on the wind set

Lat 16° 23' 28" N
Long 154° 46' W

HKF Course Wind & Remarks on board Saturday Oct 27th

2 S. P. Calt commenced with a strong breeze and
4 fair weather ship steering a buoy
6 all sail at employed in painting
8 some & B. N. by E. and latter as above
10 at 6 o'clock we saw the land the Island
12 of Moorea and lying becalmed off of the
point of Lahaia in company with
ship Albatross

4 days

HKF Course Wind & REMARKS On board Sunday Oct 28th

2 commenced with a calm ship within
4 8 miles of the anchorage at 8 PM
6 towed in with the boats at 9 came
8 to anchor in thirty fathoms of water
10 latter part strong gale from the N. E.
12 thus ends 30 ships lying by

Monday Oct 29th
commenced with fresh
gale from the N. E. latter part
moderate employed in securing the ship
thus ends

Ship Nimrod Lying at anchor at the point of Lahaia
Tuesday Oct the 30th

commenced with moderate weather got off 9 pipes
of bread 40 bbls of potatoes & at 6 PM weighed anchor
for Honolulu N. by E. strong breeze from the N. E. ship
steering W. by N. under double reefed topmasts at 12 M came to anchor
in 14 fathoms of water thus ends

Wednesday Oct the 31st
commenced with squally weather ship lying
in the outer roadstead at Honolulu harbor N. by E. and
latter part a strong breeze ship lying at anchor out side of the
reef waiting for the pilot vessel

Thursday Oct the 1st
all the 24 hours fresh breeze waiting
for an opportunity to get within the reef
thus ends

Friday Nov the 2nd
all the 24 hours strong breeze and squally
no ships got in side of the reef this day

Saturday Nov the 3rd
all the 24 hours as above fresh breeze
from the N. E. and squally

Sunday Oct the 4th
all the 24 hours as above thus ends

Monday Nov the 5th
all the 24 hours moderate weather at
daylight took the anchor at 4 o'clock got within
the reef ends warping the ship in

Tuesday Nov the 6th
all the 24 hours fair weather sent 20 casks on
shore for water employed in making preparation for hoisting out oil
thus ends

Wednesday Nov the 7th
all the 24 hours fair weather employed in
breaking out oil & fitting it for shipping home thus ends

Thursday Nov the 8th
all the 24 hours employed in hoisting
oil & stowing off the main hatch way thus ends
