for sea waiting to ship board the men have about
all deserted the ship at 3 o'clock the alarm of fire was
given on board of ship got a splinter of iron pipe put the
fire out by drenching the ship in the act of running the
ship on the reef the Captain thus ends

Friday Nov the 30th

These 24 hours as above waiting for hands

Saturday Dec the 1st

These 24 hours fine weather the ship ready
for sea waiting about 8 men to complete our complement
thus ends

Sunday Dec the 2nd

These 24 hours pleasant weather & thus ends

Monday Dec the 3rd

This day pleasant weather ship several natives
discharged the third & fourth Office on account of
ill health ship one Mr Brightman as third mate
& Vennip one of our Boatstewards to fourth mate thus ends
