

Ship *Amrad* in Pursuit of Sperm Whales
 Remarks on board Sunday Feb 3rd 1830

commenced with a fresh breeze from the N.W. and fair weather ship by the wind bearing W saw two ships steering in to the Eastward from that ship under easy sail heading N.W. Latter to moderate breeze ship steering W by S at 10 o'clock got a lunar this eve
 Lat 38° S Long by Lunar 170° 56'

Remarks on board Monday Feb 4th

commenced with a moderate breeze from the S.W. ship steering W by S at 11 o'clock saw Ocean Island bearing S.W. kept the ship off to windward the land at 6 o'clock the ship by the wind took in sail ship heading N.W. the land about 15° off Latter part steering in towards the land all sail set and lying with mainmast aback off from island in company with *Barque Antonio* of New Bedford this eve
 Lat 33° S Long 169° 18' E

Remarks on board Tuesday Feb 5th

commenced with a light breeze from the N.E. ship steering W in company with *Barque Antonio* Main Part by the Wind bearing N.W. Latter part a light air ship steering W all sail set this eve
 Lat 29° S Long 168° 26' E

Remarks on board Wednesday Feb 6th

commenced with a light air from the N.E. ship steering W all sail set Main Part under easy sail a light air & a heavy swell on Latter to a light fair from the N. ship all sail set steering W by S saw a sail, this eve the water variously employed such as taring the rigging &c
 Lat 20° S Long 167° 38' E

Remarks on board Thursday Feb 7th

commenced with a light air from the N.E. ship steering W at sunset took in sail luffed the ship up E by the wind at 12 o'clock put away ship to the N.W. at daylight made sail kept the ship off W by S at 8 o'clock saw a school of Sperm Whales to the windward and a strong breeze from the S.W. ship under a press of sail working to the windward in chase of Whales
 Lat 27° S Long 167° 18' E

Remarks on Friday Feb 8th

commenced with fresh breeze from the S.W. ship all sail set in chase of Whales at 8 o'clock saw them up took in sail luffed part ship heading E Latter part steering South for Phoenix Island and the land in sight
 Lat 23° S Long 167° 15' E

commanded by Wm. H. Sherman 1830
 Remarks on board Saturday Feb 9th

commenced with a fresh breeze from the N.E. ship steering S.W. for the land at 2 o'clock luffed to with mainmast aback in order to get boats for the boat Main Part lying off 3 o'clock Latter part a strong breeze from the S.W. took in a white man for 35-00 silver with 4 eggs let him have a Boats in exchange this eve
 Lat 33° S Long 169° 18' E

Remarks on board Sunday Feb 10th

commenced with a strong breeze from the S.W. and gradually ship steering N.W. the wind at 3 o'clock took in sail Latter to a strong breeze ship heading N under double reefed topsail Mainmast & jib this eve
 Lat 39° S Long 166° 52' E

Remarks on board Monday Feb 11th

commenced with a strong breeze from the S.W. ship by the wind bearing N. under double reefed topsail Mainmast & jib at 6 o'clock were ship to the S & took in the Mainmast & jib a strong breeze through the night Latter part ship with whole topsail set steering by the wind heading S to this eve
 Lat 20° N Long 166° 54' E

Remarks on board Tuesday Feb 12th

commenced with a fresh breeze from the S.W. ship by the wind bearing S.W. Main Part variable weather frequent squalls of rain Latter to a light air and fair weather ship heading N by W this eve
 Lat 19° S Long 166° 45' E

Remarks on board Wednesday Feb 13th

commenced with a light air from the S.W. ship heading S Main Part under easy sail Latter to a fresh breeze from the S.W. end ship steering S.W. employed in rigging up the fore topsail
 Lat 9° S Long 166° 30' E

Remarks on Thursday Feb 14th

commenced with a fresh breeze from the S.W. & variable weather ship steering S.W. Main Part gradually ship under easy sail Latter part variable weather ship heading to the Westward this eve in obs. this day
 Lat by account 6° S Long 166° 54' E
