

Ship Nimrod Lying at Anchor at the Island of Guam
Monday March 11th

These 24 hours fair weather the watch
on shore employed in getting off men & their arms

Tuesday March 12th

These 24 hours pleasant weather employed in
getting off men the watch on shore this end

Wednesday March 13th 14th 15th & 16th fine weather employed
in getting off recruits the watch on shore this end

Monday March 18th fine weather and light air. Did not
weigh our anchor & made full sail for Amathia
Lat 16° 30' N Long 145° 40' W

Tuesday March 19

These 24 hours pleasant weather got off 131 bbls
of water & stowed it away this end

Wednesday March 20th

These 24 hours pleasant weather employed
in watering the ship

Thursday March 21st

Pleasant weather this day finished getting
our water on board got in all 124 1/2 bbls this end

Friday March 22nd These 24 hours fair weather and a
fresh breeze from the N.E. at 8 AM got the ship
under way and working to the windward

Saturday March 23rd

Commenced with a strong breeze
from the N.E. ship under a press of sail
heading N.W. the windward in order to take
Capt. Dore on board in company with
Ship Dove. Wind part bying off & on
latter part fair weather Lat 20° 40' N Long 145° 40' W
& Lady came on board made all sail on the ship
kept her by the wind heading N.W. thus end

Sunday March 24th

These 24 hours moderate weather
Ship by the wind heading N.W. all sail set
in company with Ship Dove & Jefferson thus end.

Lat 14° 36' N Long 145° 05' E

Remarks on board Monday March 15th 1858

Commenced with
a light air from the N.E. ship by the wind
heading N.W. all sail set at mid part. Dore
a strong breeze ship by the wind heading
N.W. & Dore thus end.

Remarks on board Tuesday March 16th

Commenced with a
strong breeze from the N.E. & Dore weather
Ship by the wind heading N.W. in company
with Ship Dove and Jefferson. Wind part & latter
a strong breeze ship under double reefed topsails employed
in repairing the main sail thus end.

Remarks on board Wednesday March 17th

Commenced with a
strong breeze from the N.E. ship by the wind
heading N.W. under double reefed topsails at
5 PM at the main sail the ship Dove & Jefferson
in sight. Wind part & latter more moderate but
the breeze out of the topsails set the main topsails
and sail thus end.

Remarks on board Thursday March 18th

Commenced with
a fresh breeze from the N.E. ship by the wind
heading N.W. in fair weather
under topsails. Wind part & latter a light air ship by the
wind thus end.

Remarks on board Friday March 19th

Commenced with a light
air from the N.E. ship by the wind heading N.W.
in company with the ship Dove & Jefferson. Wind part &
latter a fresh breeze from the N.E. ship by
the wind heading N.W. thus end.

Remarks on board Saturday March 20th

Commenced with a strong
breeze from the N.E. ship by the wind heading N.W.
by the wind all sail set heading N.W. & latter
a moderate breeze from the N.E.
ship heading N.W. thus end.
