

Ship Nimrod In The Arctic Ocean 1850
Monday July 8th

Commence with a fresh breeze from the S.E. and cloudy weather employed in boiling & chasing Whales. S.E. Wind Part thick weather. Latter part the same with a fresh breeze on from the Eastward ship lying with Mainmast aback thus ends the day.
Lat 68° 40' N Long 172° 30' W

Tuesday July 9th
Commence with thick weather and moderate breeze employed in boiling & storing away some blubber. Wind Part as above. Latter part fine weather employed in chasing Whales & other ends.
Lat 68° 00' N

Wednesday July 10th
Commence with fair weather and a strong breeze from the S.E. employed in boiling & chasing Whales. Wind Part a moderate Gale of rain. Ship under canvas sail. Shook ship John of New Bedford. Latter part a strong breeze from the Eastward ship steering to the South in toward the land employed in cupping pipes at 11 AM finished boiling thus ends the day.
Lat 68° 00' N Long 173° 31' W

Thursday July 11th
Commence with a fresh breeze from the S.E. ship by the wind hearing in toward the land at 2 PM saw it and abundance of sea. Wind Part a fresh breeze a drizzle. Lat 68° 00' N. Latter part took him to the ship. S.E. commenced storing down pipes of oil between 10 AM thus ends the day.

Friday July 12th
Commence with a strong breeze & rugged ship lying by a whale employed in storing down oil between 10 AM. Wind Part a more moderate at 2 PM commenced butting and fine weather employed in boiling.
Lat 68° 17' N Long 172° 30' W

Saturday July 13th
Commence with fine weather and light breezes from the N.W. Wind Part steering S.E. employed in boiling. Latter part fair weather saw the land & sea employed as above thus ends the day.

Sunday July 14th

Commence with fresh gales ship under double reefed topsails heading in toward the land saw a few Whales in near the sea employed in boiling. Wind Part more moderate. Latter part the same thus ends the day in sight.
Lat 68° 20' N Long 172° 30' W

Monday July 15th
Commence with moderate weather the sea in sight in company with ship. Sailing employed in cupping pipes. S.E. boiling. Wind Part thick ship with Mainmast aback. Latter part a light air and variable weather employed in storing down. Lat 68° 00' N finished boiling thus ends the day.

Tuesday July 16th
Commence with fair weather and a light air from the Eastward the sea in sight employed in storing down. Wind Part thick weather. Latter part fine weather. Wind moderate breezes employed as above thus ends the day.
Lat 68° 00' N Long 173° 31' W

Wednesday July 17th
Commence with fine weather and moderate breeze. Ship with all sail set a looking for the Whales. Employed in storing down. Wind Part a fresh breeze from the S.E. ship steering S.E. at 1 PM had to heave her off on account of sea. Latter part a fresh breeze this by the wind hearing to the Eastward the land in sight the water employed in cupping. Bone thus ends the day.
Lat 68° 00' N Long 174° 08' W

Thursday July 18th
Commence with fair weather and moderate breeze. Ship with all sail set a looking for the Whales. Employed in sight & not any of them a Whaling the water employed in cupping. Bone. Wind Part strong breeze from the S.W. ship heading S.E. employed as above. Latter part calm employed in storing away Bone & other ends the day in sight.
Lat 68° 22' N

Friday July 19th
Commence with light air and pleasant weather employed in storing away Bone & other ends. Wind Part a breeze from the Eastward ship heading in for the land. Latter part ship among the sea & was in with the land thus ends the day.
