 in washing ship thus ends

 Commence with a severe gale of wind ship
 lying under main topgallant a heavy sea on
 at 4 P.M. lost 2 casks of water ship lying
 with her rail under most of the time
 Wind part a blustering heavy at 6 lost the
 & boat stove the 1st boat latter part more
 moderate commenced moderating at 2 P.M.
 at 4 P.M. made some sail & wore ship the
 gale was wrecked in some blow away some of
 our sails bulwarks & ends moderate but
 a heavy swell on
 Lat by Obs 42° 40' N
