

Ship Annrod on her Passage Towards
Friday March 28th

Ther 24 hours variable weather
First part a fresh breeze from the N.E. and rain
Ship with all sail at steering a course S.E. by E. the
last calm fair weather Latter part a moderate
breeze from the Westward came as above and the
standing sails set

Saturday March 29th Lat 36° 00' S Long 137° 30' W

commenced with a fresh breeze from
the N.W. ship with standing sails at steering S.E.
by E. at 4 P.M. took in the Mizzen Mast and 2nd Lt.
last strong gales & squally thus ends

Sunday March 30th Lat 37° 50' S Long 135° 10' W

commenced with strong gales from the N.W. ship
and squally ship steering S.E. by E. as a course
all sail set that is prudent to take the part
squally fore & Mizzen topgallant sails in
Latter part all sail set main royal fore
topmast standing sail at the bow as above
thus ends

Monday March 31st Lat 39° 20' S Long 132° 00' W

commenced with fresh gales from the N.W. ship
and clear weather ship all sail at steering S.E. by E.
Miz Part and Latter the light sails all in but
main topgallant sail lower S.E. by E. thus ends

Tuesday April 1st Lat 40° 40' S Long 124° 00' W

commenced with fresh gales from the Westward
and frequent squally ship under a press of sail
steering S.E. by E. Miz Part the wind from the
S.W. Latter part the wind from the Westward and
more moderate ship with all sail at steering S.E.
thus ends

Wednesday April 2nd Lat 42° 20' S Long 125° 20' W

Ther 24 hours a fine breeze from
the Westward ship steering a course
S.E. by E. all sail set standing sails below and
aloft the weather fair thus ends
