Saturday, Mar. 27th. First part, fine
weather and strong winds from the
North, steering East, variously employed
Middle part, made the Island of
St. Pauls, bearing E. by S. luffed to
the wind with the head to windward
latter part, stood in toward the island
and sent two boats in fishing

Sunday, Mar. 28th. First part, fine
weather and strong wind from
the North, lying off 2 or 3 miles at St Pauls
Middle part steering E. by S. Latter
part, the same.

weather and strong wind from the
South, steering E. by S. variously employed
Middle part, & latter part, the same.

Lat. 33° 19' Long 90° 10'

Thursday, Mar. 32nd. First part, fine weather
and strong winds from the South
steering E. by S. variously employed.
Middle part, strong winds & squally. Latter
part, the same, saw a finback.

Lat. 33° 1' Long 93° 20'

Friday, Apr. 2nd. First part, fine weather
and strong winds from the S. W.
steering E. by S. variously employed
Middle part, & latter part, nothing
particular.

Lat. 32° 45' Long 95° 25'

Saturday, Apr. 3rd. First part, fine weather
and light winds from the S. E. steering by
the wind to the E. by S. variously employed
Middle part, moderate winds latter part
the same, saw finbacks repairing sail.

Sunday, Apr. 4th. First part, fine weather
and light breeze from the S. E. steering by
the wind to the N. E. saw a sail. Middle
