and strong winds from the S. E.

sails. Middle part, shortened sail.

and strong wind from the S. E.
steering S. E. variously employed.
Middle part, shortened sail. Latter
part, variously employed.

and strong winds from the S. E. steering
S. E. Middle part, shortened sail. Latter
part, fine weather, all hands looking for whales.

Lat. 25° 45' Long. 108° 59'
Monday, Apr. 12th. First part, fine weather
and moderate winds from the S. E. steering
S. E. Middle part, shortened sail. Latter
part, sent a fore & main topsail & fore sail.

Lat. 23° 20' Long. 109° 58'
Tuesday, Apr. 13th. First part fine weather
and light air from the South, steering
to the Eastward, sent an old main sail.
Middle part, shortened sail. Latter part,
tacked ship to the N. N. W. saw a breach
variously employed.

Lat. 23° 14' Long. 109° 59'
Wednesday, Apr. 14th. First part, fine
weather and light breeze from the
South, steering by the wind to the
Westward, lowered two boats after
Blackfish, but did not catch any.
Middle part, shortened sail. Latter
part, variously employed.

Lat. 22° 30' Long. 109° 30'
Thursday, Apr. 15th. First part fine weather
and light wind from the S. W.
saw *Sperm* whale, loosed, and caught
one. Middle part, took him along side
and put him to rest. Latter part, cutting

Lat. 21° 19' Long. 109° 25'
Friday, Apr. 16th. First part, fine weather
and strong wind from the South, finishing
cutting Middle & Latter part, boiling.

Lat. 20° 50' Long. 108° 40'
Saturday, Apr. 17th. First part fine weather &
strong wind, at South, employed boiling
Middle part, the same. Latter part, still
boiling.
