finished boiling. Latter part, saw finbacks.

Monday, Apr. 19th. First part, fine weather &
strong wind from the South, steering
by the wind to the Eastward. Middle part,
shortened sail. Latter part, wore ship to the
S.W. Strong gales at S.E. variously employed.

Tuesday, Apr. 20th. First part, clear weather
and strong gales from the S.E. steering
by the wind to the S.W. variously
employed. Middle part, shortened sail.
Latter part, employed cooping provisions.

Wednesday, Apr. 21st. First part, fine weather
and moderate wind at S.E. steering by
the wind to the Eastward, employed
cooping provisions. Saw several finbacks.
Middle part, shortened sail. Latter part
wore ship to the E. W. S.W. variously emp.

Thursday, Apr. 22nd. First part, fine weather
and strong winds from the South steering
by the wind to the W. S.W. variously emp.
Middle part, shortened sail. Latter part
wore ship to the Eastward, variously employ.

Friday, Apr. 23rd. First part, fine weather
and strong wind at South steering by
the wind to the Eastward, variously
employed. Middle part, shortened sail.
wore ship to the S.W. saw 1 finback.
unbent the spanker and altered it
and bent it again.

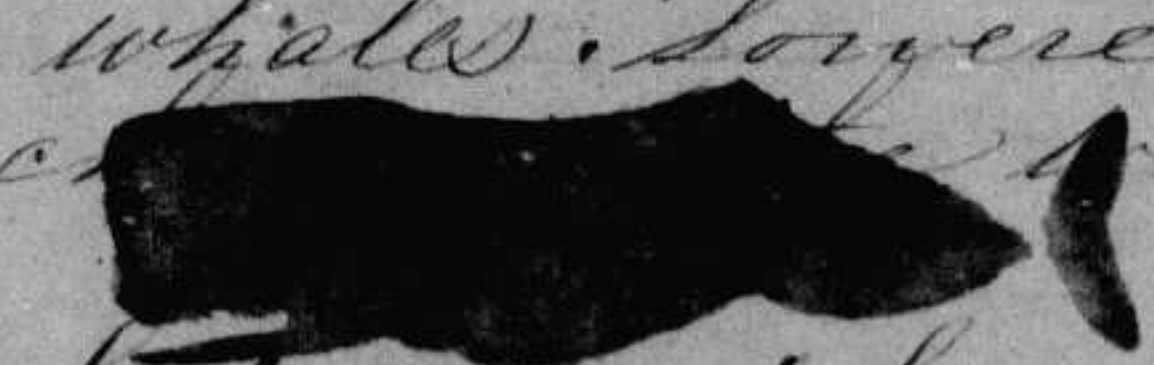
Saturday, Apr. 24th. First part, fine weather

Sunday, Apr. 25th. First part, fine weather
strong gales at South, steering by the wind
to the Eastward. Middle part, shortened sail.
Latter part, nothing particular.

Monday, Apr. 26th. First part, fine weather
and moderate winds from the S. S.E.
steering by the wind to the S.W.
Middle part, shortened sail. Latter part
cruising for whales.

Tuesday, Apr. 27th. First part, fine weather
and strong gales, cruising for whales.
Middle part, shortened sail. Latter part,
at work on the old boat, steering at W.

Wednesday, Apr. 28th. First part, fine weather
and light winds from the S.E. saw a four
large whales, lowered our boat, and struck
one, and hauled from him. Middle
part, took up the boat, and shortened
sail. Middle part, cruising for whales.

Thursday, Apr. 29th. First part, fine weather
and strong wind, steering W. Middle
part, shortened sail. Latter part, strong
wind, saw sperm whales, lowered our
boat, and struck  boat was stove.

Friday, Apr. 30th. First part, fine weather
but a very rough sea, took the alongside
and commenced cutting. Middle part
lashed down for the night. Latter part
continued cutting.
