Remarks on Board Ship, toward which
Sunday June 8th First part fine weather
and a moderate wind, at 10 o'clock
beating up the Straits, at sunset came
to anchor off Angier point in ten
fathoms water, furlled sail.
Satter part, at ten o'clock weighed anchor
and beat up the Straits, at twelve came
to anchor off Angier in ten fathoms
water.

Wednesday June 9th First part furlled
sail and squared the yards, beating
Satter part, One watch on liberty.

Thursday, June 10th First part, One watch
on liberty, Several Ships passed through
the Straits, Satter part, One watch on
liberty, Received a visit from the Governor.

Wednesday, June 11th First part, One watch
on liberty, Satter part, the same.

Saturday, June 12th First part, One
watch on liberty, Satter part, the same.

Sunday, June 13th One watch on liberty
Satter part, the same.

Monday, June 14th First part, One watch
on liberty, Satter part, the same.

Tuesday, June 15th First part, One watch
on liberty, Satter part, employed taking
on board our recruits.

Wednesday, June 16th First part,
employed taking on board our
recruits, Satter part, at six o'clock,
at 10 got under way and steamed
out of the Straits of Sunda.

Leaving at Angier, Thursday, June 17th
First part, fine wind at N.E.
steering W. S. W. the ship in the
entrance to the Straits of Sunda
Middle part, strong wind and rainy
Satter part, light wind and rainy
employed storing chairs, & trunks,
Saw the Ship, steering by the wind.

Lat 7° 51' Long 105° 5'
Friday, June 18th First part, fine weather
and calm, variously employed, Middle
part, calm, Satter part, the same,
bied the current and found it set
16 miles E. S. E. Saw large quantity
of drift wood, caught three turtles.

Lat 7° 34' Long 105° 21'
Saturday, June 19th First part, fine weather
and calm, saw large quantity of
drift wood, Middle part, a very light
breeze at South, steering E. S. E.
Satter part, calm, saw the south coast
of Java, bearing North, dist 40 miles.

Lat 7° 38' Long 105° 39'
Sunday, June 20th First part, fine and
light, at South, steering E. S. E.,
variously employed, Middle part,
calm, Satter part, the same.

Lat 8° 5' Long 105° 8'
Monday, June 21st First part, fine
weather and calm, Satter part,
calm and rainy, the land in sight.

Lat 8° 10' Long 107° 11'
Tuesday, June 22nd First part, rainy
wind at West, steering S. E. by S.
Nine Cooper's point in sight, dist 40
miles, Middle part moderate breeze
at E. S. E., Satter part, Squally
variously employed.

Lat 8° 56' Long 107° 13'
