weather and light breezes at E.
steering by the wind to the
W. S.W. variously employed.
Middle part. Light breezes at S.E.
steering by the wind to the S.W.
Latter part. the same. variously employed.

Lat. 10° 30' Long 108° 40'
Friday, July 25th. First part. Fine weather
and light breezes at S. S.E. steering
by the wind to the S.W. Middle
part the same. Latter part saw
Christmas Island bearing N.W. dist 60

Lat. 11° 40' Long 104° 59'
Saturday, June 26th. First part fine
weather and strong wind at
S. S.E. steering by the wind to the
S.W. tacked ship to the East. saw a
sail. Middle part. Strong winds and
squally. Latter part the same.

Lat. 12° 20' Long 105° 10'
Sunday, June 27th. First part. Squally
weather and strong winds at S. S.E.
steering by the wind to the S.W.
saw a school of sperm whales going
to windward quick. lowered our
boats in pursuit, but could not
catch them. Middle part. tacked
ship several times. Latter part
the same.

Lat. 12° 31' Long 104° 26'

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on her passage from Tonga toward Whaling ground
Monday, June 28th. First part. fine weather
and strong winds at S.E. steering by the
wind to the S.W. Middle part. tacked ship
to the South. Latter part. tacked ship to
the S.W. variously employed.

Lat. 12° 24' Long 105° 45'
Tuesday, June 29th. First part. fine
weather and moderate wind at
S.E. steering by the wind to the S.W.
variously employed. Middle part.
tacked ship to the S.W. Latter part
nothing particular.

Lat. 12° 45' Long 105° 32'
Wednesday, June 30th. First part. clear weather
and strong gales. tacked ship to the S.E.
saw no ships. Middle part. wore ship
to the South. Latter part. strong gales
and a very rough sea. saw no ships.

Lat. 12° 46' Long 105° 17'
Thursday, July 1st. First part. cloudy
weather and strong gales at E. & E.
steering by the wind to the South.
saw a sail. Middle part. & Latter the same.

Lat. 16° 28' Long 104° 31'
Wednesday, July 2nd. First part. fine
weather and strong gales at E. & E.
steering by the wind to the South.
Middle part saw a sail. Latter part
variously employed.

Lat. 16° 24' Long 104° 41'
Saturday, July 3rd. First part. fine weather
and strong wind at East. steering by
the wind to the S. S.E. variously employed.
Middle part. & Latter part. the same.

Lat. 13° 9' Long 105° 00'

and again today.
