Remains on Board Ship & in view of white cap.
Saturday July 31st. First part, fine weather
and strong gales at S.E. steering to the E.N.
up bent the main sail, and a large sperm
whale, lowered and made a mess went
up alongside of the whale and dived two
times clear. Saw boat, 10.2. Middle part,
shortened sail, latter part, moderate wind
saw a sail, put on oil below in the tubercle.

Lat 24° 9' Long 105° 25'

Sunday, Aug. 1st. First part, fine weather and
light wind, put S.E. steering to the south, various
employed. Middle part, looked ship to the S.E.
latter part, saw finbacks.

Lat 23° 59' Long 105° 40'

Monday, Aug. 2nd. First part, fine weather
and moderate wind at S.E. steering to the
S.E. saw finbacks, split our sail, and
bent another. Middle part, latter part,
look in the barboard boat, & put out an overhead
boat, set out the fore & main rigging.

Lat 23° 40' Long 105° 39'

Tuesday, Aug. 3rd. First part, fine weather and
moderate wind at S.E. steering to the south
set out the top mast & top gallant rigging,
saw finbacks, at work on the barboard, hoist
latter part, fine weather, variously employed.

Lat 24° 19' Long 105° 29'

Wednesday, Aug. 4th. First part, fine weather,
and light winds, variously employed
saw a dead whale, saved his jaw. Latter
part, variously employed.

Lat 23° 57' Long 105° 40'

Thursday, Aug. 5th. First part, fine weather
and moderate winds at south
steering to the East, variously employed
latter part, variously employed.

Lat 23° 30' Long 105° 59'

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for sperm whales off the coast of New Holland.
Friday, Aug. 6th. First part, fine weather
and strong wind at south, steering to the
East, put out the barboard boat, latter part
steering south, variously employed.

Lat 24° 10' Long 107° 55'

Saturday, Aug. 7th. First part, fine weather
and moderate winds at East, steering south,
variously employed. Middle part, wind shifted
steering south, latter part, the same.

Lat 25° 43' Long 107° 29'

Sunday, Aug. 8th. First part, squally, with
strong winds at S.W. steering south,
variously employed, latter part, lying to
headed to the S.E.

Lat 25° 17' Long 107° 25'

Monday, Aug. 9th. First part, clear weather and
strong gale at S.W. lying to headed to the S.E. Middle
part, wore ship to the S.W. latter part, hard gale.

Lat 26° 1' Long 107° 9'

Tuesday, Aug. 10th. First part, squally with a hard
gale at S.W. lying to headed to the S.W.
under storm sails, latter part, moderate
steering to the Eastward, variously employed.

Lat 25° 36' Long 107° 48'

Wednesday, Aug. 11th. First part, strong gales at
S.E. headed to the Eastward, under three
close reefed top sails. Middle part, wore ship to
the South, latter part, wore ship to the East.

Lat 25° 20' Long 107° 58'

Thursday, Aug. 12th. First part, squally, with
strong winds at South, steering to the East,
variously employed. Latter part, the same,
saw finbacks, passed a large piece of squid, all hands
employed making feed.

Lat 24° 49' Long 108° 11'

Friday, Aug. 13th. First part, squally, with strong
wind at South, steering to the East, saw finbacks,
all hands making feed. Middle part, wore ship
latter part, wore ship, variously employed.
