Saturday Aug 28th First part, fine weather and
latter part, squally weather and baffling wind
steering by the wind, variously employed.

Lat. 22° 37' Long 109° 50'

Sunday, Aug 29th First part, fine weather, and
baffling wind steering by the wind on different
tricks, variously employed. Latter part, strong
wind at S.E. steering to the S.W.

Lat 23° 18' Long 109° 15'

Monday, Aug 30th First part, fine weather and
strong wind at S.E. steering to the S.W.
latter part, the same, variously employed.

Lat 24° 15' Long 107° 20'

Tuesday, Aug 31st First part, fine weather and
moderate wind at S.E. steering to the S.W.
variously employed. Latter part, the same.

Lat 24° 11' Long 108° 19'

Wednesday, Sept. 1st First part, fine weather &
moderate wind at S.E. steering to the S.W.
variously employed. Middle part, lashed
Ship to the S.E. Latter part, wore Ship to the
S.W. Saw finbacks, variously employed.

Lat 25° 30' Long 108° 40'

Thursday, Sept. First part, fine weather, and
moderate wind at S.E. steering to the S.W.
lashed Ship to the S.E. and finbacks.
Sitting to the S.W. & S. by the way. Latter
part calm, variously employed.

Lat 25° 20' Long 109° 12'

Friday, Sept. 3rd First part, fine weather &
light S.W. steering to the S.E.
Saw a school of sperm whale, lowered our
boats in pursuit but did not succeed
striking. Latter part, strong wind at
West steering different courses.
Saw a beech.

Lat 25° 28' Long 109° 30'
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Sperm whale on the coast of New Holland
Sept 4th First part, fine weather and strong
wind at West, steering different course, I
saw pumpies. Latter part, strong wind at South
steering to the Westward, employed starting water.

Lat 25° 16' Long 109° 45'

Saturday, Sept 5th First part, fine weather and
strong wind at S.E. steering to the S.W. doing nothing
the 2nd part and a going hard at work making
a running latter. Latter part, baffling wind
and squally weather, steering to the Southward.

Lat 26° 5' Long 108° 59'

Sunday, Sept. 6th First part, fine weather
and moderate wind at S.E. steering to the
South. Latter part, fine weather steering to the
S.E. saw finback, went to the fore top sail and bent
another, employed repairing the fore top sail.

Lat 25° 39' Long 109° 5'

Tuesday, Sept. 7th First part, squally weather and
strong wind at S.E. steering to the S.E. at
work repairing fore top sail, saw finback. Latter
part, fine weather, at work on the fore top sail.
Saw finbacks, steering to the south.

Lat 25° 55' Long 109° 50'

Wednesday, Sept. 8th First part, fine weather
and strong wind at S.E. steering to the South
finished repairing the fore top sail and bent it.
Latter part, steering to the East, nothing doing.

Lat 26° 30' Long 107° 47'

Thursday, Sept. 9th First part, fine weather and
strong wind at S.E. steering to the East. Saw
a school of large A. Nicor. Latter part, spoke the
Ship William Gardner of London.

Lat 26° 2' Long 109° 33'

Friday, Sept. 10th First part, strong wind at S.E.
steering to the East. Latter part, calm. The tow
had a litter of pigs, feed the current and
found it sitting. It is one half knot per hour
furnished the latter, and the 15th cat has gone
having distracted.
