

Remarkson Board Ship's Keeman, while cruising for Thursday June 7th First part, fine weather and strong wind at N.W. steering to the S.W. variously employed middle part, Shortened sail. Latter part, saw three large sperm whales towards our boat and struck one.

Lat 20° 20' Long 152° 50'

Friday June 8th First part, killed one whale took him alongside and commenced cutting, at 11 P.M. lashed down, Latter part, at daylight commenced cutting, slight breeze at S.W.

Lat 20° 22' Long 153° 30'

Saturday June 9th Begins with moderate S.W. wind at 2 P.M. finished cutting and began baling, middle & latter part, employed baling, cutting up the Butes and preparing cask, caught some small fish, & saw many birds.

Lat 20° 50' Long 153° 20'

Sunday June 10th Begins with moderate westerly winds and hazy weather, employed baling, middle part, strong wind at S.W. Latter part, strong S.W. wind, employed baling.

Lat 21° 12' Long 152° 25'

Monday June 11th Begins with strong south and rough sea, employed baling, middle part, at 11 P.M. finished baling, some sails. Latter part, foggy, caught two dolphins.

Lat 21° 45' Long 152° 20'

Tuesday June 12th First part, foggy, wind at South, ship headed to the Eastward, Latter part, fair weather employed setting up some shooks.

Lat 21° 25' Long 153° 35'

Wednesday June 13th First part, light wind and calm, ship headed to the Eastward setting up shooks, middle part, calm. Latter part, saw sperm whale lowered our boats in pursuit, without success, employed stowing oil in the main hold.

Lat 21° 45' Long 154° 10'

Thursday June 14th Begins with light N.W. and fine weather, finished stowing oil, Latter part at daylight saw sperm whale towards our boat without success.

Lat 22° 30' Long 154° 50'

Sperm whale in Japan, Friday June 15th First part, moderate S.W. wind and fine weather, boat off in pursuit of whale, at sunset boat returned to the ship without success. Latter part at 5 P.M. lowered the boat in pursuit of whale struck one, and after being fast 5 and a half hours and having three lines taken out, lost the whale by the parting of the line, but saved the lines.

Lat 22° 27' N Long 155° 00' E.

Saturday June 16th Begins with strong wind and clear weather at 10 took up one boat and kept the ship off for when we saw the whale last, came up with whale towards our boat, struck one, killed him took him alongside and cut in his body, middle part lying by the head, Latter part at daylight took in the head, thick squally weather, cut up the whale.

Lat 22° 00' N Long 158° 10' E.
