Remained in Port. Since 1st human whale arriving, from previous Monday, June 27th. First part, fine weather and light breeze at South, ship headed to the East, saw 1 Blackback, middle part, under short sail, latter part, variously employed, wind S.W. steering East.

Monday, June 28th. First part, fine weather and light winds at S.W. steering S.E. saw 1 Blackback, variously employed, middle part, short sail, latter part, steering S.E.

Tuesday, June 29th. First part, fine weather and moderate winds at South, steering S.E. variously employed, saw 1 Blackback, middle part, short sail, latter part, squally, saw 1 Blackback, variously employed.

Wednesday, June 30th. First part, fine weather and moderate winds at S.W. steering to the S.E. saw 1 Blackback & porpoise, variously employed, middle part, were ship to the West, latter part, heavy weather and strong wind at S.W. with slight rain.

Thursday, July 1st. First part, thick weather and strong wind at S.W. with a very rough sea, steering to the S.W. variously employed, middle part, raining, latter part, changeable weather and strong wind at South.

Friday, July 2nd. First part, clear weather and strong winds at South, steering West, middle part same, latter part, fine weather and moderate wind S.E. steering West, employed repairing our toys.

Saturday, July 3rd. First part, fine weather and strong wind at S.E. steering West, variously employed, middle part, short sail, latter part, strong winds at S.E.

Sunday, July 4th. First part, squally, with strong winds at South, steering west by South, middle part, raining, strong wind at S.W. latter part, fine weather, saw 1 Gump.

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Whale on surface. Tuesday, July 5th. First part, fine weather and moderate winds at South, steering W.N.W. variously employed, middle part, raining, latter part, raining, squally, we then, were ship to the Eastward.

Wednesday, July 6th. First part, squally weather and strong winds at S.E. steering to the Eastward, saw a few backs, middle part, squally, latter part, squally & raining, wind at S.W.

Thursday, July 7th. First part, squally weather and strong wind at S.W. steering to the S.E. middle part, foggy, latter part, fine weather, saw porpoises.

Friday, July 8th. First part, fine weather and moderate winds at S.W. steering to the S.E. spoke ship Hope of New Bedford had caught nothing since we saw her last, middle part, short sail, latter part, wind at S.E. saw many finbacks.

Saturday, July 9th. First part, fine weather and strong breeze at S.W. steering to the Eastward, saw finbacks, middle part, short sail, latter part, cloudy.

Sunday, July 10th. First part, cloudy with moderate winds at S.W. steering to the West, variously employed, middle part, squally, latter part, variable wind, with rain, spoke ship Hope of New Bedford, had not taken anything since we saw her last.

Monday, July 11th. First part, cloudy, squally weather with variable winds, in company with Hope, middle part, short sail, parted from Hope, latter part, light wind at S.E. steering to the Eastward, started water, saw 1 Blackback & porpoises.

Tuesday, July 12th. First part, fine weather and light winds at S.E. were ship to the S.W. saw 1 Blackback, middle part, short sail, latter part, variously employed, saw the Hesper, porpoises & gump.

Wednesday, July 13th. First part, fine weather & moderate winds at S.E. steering S.W. saw 1 Porpoise, employed drawing & knocking ground Hope in sight, middle part, short sail, latter part, saw 1 finback, wind East, steering variously courses.
