

Remarked on Board Ship Kormoran while cruising  
 Tuesday April 15<sup>th</sup> First part, fine weather and moderate wind  
 at N.E. steering N.E.W. variously employed, latter part, same,  
 Lat 18° 47' N. Long 157° 10' E

Wednesday April 17<sup>th</sup> First part, fine weather and moderate wind at  
 N.E. steering N.E.W. at 2 P.M. saw the island of Kormoran  
 lying N.W. by S 20 miles, it was boarded by a Pilot, who  
 left again as we were not on his list, Middle part, off 4  
 hrs, latter part, at ten o'clock, came to anchor in five  
 fathoms water, fished, and sent in draft of cash  
 for water, employed watering, scrubbing, &c.

Thursday April 18<sup>th</sup> Latter part, the same,  
 Friday April 19<sup>th</sup> Employed watering, latter part, same,  
 Saturday April 20<sup>th</sup> Employed watering, latter part, working  
 and trading, weather fine,  
 Sunday April 21<sup>st</sup> One watch on liberty,  
 Monday April 22<sup>nd</sup> One watch on liberty, employed watering  
 and trading,  
 Tuesday April 23<sup>rd</sup> One watch on liberty, employed trading  
 Wednesday April 24<sup>th</sup> One watch on liberty, employed trading  
 Thursday April 25<sup>th</sup> See account, at 11 o'clock, got underway, went  
 to sea, one of the crew deserted from the boat that  
 went of the cage anchor.

Friday April 26<sup>th</sup> First part, squally with moderate wind  
 at N.E. steering by the wind to the E.S.E. employed  
 steering anchor, and chains, at 5 P.M. tacked ship  
 and passed to windward of the island, Middle & latter  
 part, steering N.W.W. squally, wind S.E.  
 Lat 17° 44' N. Long 153° 30' E

Saturday April 27<sup>th</sup> First part, squally with light wind at S.E.  
 steering North, variously employed, latter part, steering  
 North, variously employed,

Sunday April 28<sup>th</sup> First part, fine weather and moderate wind  
 at N.E. steering N.E.W. variously employed, latter part  
 the same,  
 Lat 18° 24' N. Long 152° 10' E

Monday May 1<sup>st</sup> First part, fine weather and moderate wind  
 at N.E. steering N.E.W. saw some birds, latter part, steering  
 North,  
 Lat 18° 25' N. Long 157° 50' E

for Queen Whales, 1854. - (H. Anderson) & Japan,  
 Tuesday May 2<sup>nd</sup> First part, fine weather and strong wind at East  
 steering North, variously employed, latter part, light wind  
 employed chopping wood,  
 Lat 18° 42' N. Long 157° 41' E

Wednesday May 3<sup>rd</sup> First part, fine weather and light wind at East, then  
 North, employed chopping wood, saw a bitback, and caught  
 2 dolphins, latter part, employed chopping wood,  
 Lat 18° 51' N. Long 156° 17' E

Thursday May 4<sup>th</sup> First part, fair weather and moderate breeze at  
 N. steering N.W. employed chopping wood, latter part, steering  
 N.W.W. employed chopping wood,  
 Lat 17° 52' N. Long 153° 51' E

Friday May 5<sup>th</sup> First part, fair weather and gentle breeze at N.E. steering  
 N.W. by the wind, finished chopping wood, latter part,  
 wind N.E. steering North, variously employed,  
 Lat 17° 52' N. Long 153° 46' E

Saturday May 6<sup>th</sup> First part, fine weather and moderate wind at N.E. &  
 steering North, variously employed, May 6<sup>th</sup> steering North, latter part  
 variously employed, wind light at S.E.  
 Lat 21° 51' N. Long 154° 10' E

Sunday May 7<sup>th</sup> First part, fine weather, wind very light at South, steering  
 North, variously employed, latter part, squally with moderate  
 wind from S.W. to N.W. steering by the wind, to the Northward  
 Lat 22° 11' N. Long 154° 51' E

Monday May 8<sup>th</sup> First part, squally with variable wind from S.W. to  
 North, steering by the wind to the N.E., at 5 P.M. tacked ship to  
 the N.W.W. Middle part, strong gales at N.E. with a very  
 rough sea, latter part, the same, employed chopping  
 wood in the afterhold and various other parts,  
 Lat 22° 51' N. Long 151° 30' E

Tuesday May 9<sup>th</sup> First part, clear weather and strong gale at N.E. with  
 a very rough sea, ship headed to N.W.W. under double reefed topsails  
 variously employed, saw several of black (H. Anderson),  
 Middle part, wind East steering N.W.W. latter part, the same  
 Lat 24° 17' N. Long 152° 50' E

Wednesday May 10<sup>th</sup> First part, hazy weather and strong wind at East, steering  
 N.W.W. saw several bitback, variously employed, Middle part, shortened  
 sails & altered the watches, latter part, calm, took in the mast  
 and put out another,  
 Lat 24° 30' N. Long 152° 26' E
