Wednesday May 31st First part, fair weather and variable wind. All
saw Porpoises (Grampias) & Chidack, variously employed.
Latter part, employed drawing & knotting gear.

Lat 50° 41' N. Long 105° 10' E

Thursday June 1st First part, fair weather and light wind at East, steering
N.E. employed working. Spungum, Latter part, strong wind
at West, steering various courses, saw Porpoises. Light fog squalls.

Lat 51° 21' N. Long 105° 30' E

Friday June 2nd First part, slight fog squalls, wind at N.E. & N. steering
various courses, employed making gaskets, Latter part, at
p.m. saw a school of sperm whales pursued them until
the dark night.



Lat 51° 00' N. Long 104° 26' E

Saturday June 3rd First part, at 12:00 P.M. lowered our boat in chase
of the whale caught, one took him alongside and cut in
his body, weather fair, wind moderate, at 1 P.M. &
Latter part, took in the head, at 10 P.M. began boiling.

Lat 51° 40' N. Long 103° 19' E

Sunday June 4th Begins with fair weather, at wind at S.E. &
light, employed boiling, Middle part, the same
Latter part, wind S.W.

Lat 51° 17' N. Long 103° 49' E

Monday June 5th Begins with moderate wind at S.W. steering in
various directions, employed boiling, Middle part, at 4
P.M. finished boiling, strong gales Latter part, same,

Lat 51° 09' N. Long 103° 36' E

Tuesday June 6th Begins with strong gales at S.E. & N. steering to W. & N.W.
started boiling, Latter part, much the same, saw a Finback.

Lat 51° 24' N. Long 103° 9' E

Wednesday June 7th Begins with strong gales at S.W. and hazy weather
steering to N.W. variously employed for these last two
days there has been a very rough sea. Latter part, moderate
wind, painted the starboard boat, saw Porpoises.

Lat 51° 41' N. Long 102° 30' E

Thursday June 8th Begins, wind light, at S.W. weather hazy. Ship
headed N.W. variously employed, saw a log of wood
Latter part, nearly the same.

Lat 52° 23' N. Long 101° 09' E

Friday June 9th Begins with moderate S.W. wind and hazy weather steering S.E. & S. saw
Latter part, all light squalls of rain.

Lat 51° 29' N. Long 100° 52' E

Passer Whales, for Staphors.

Tuesday June 10th Begins with very light air, at south and fair weather, put
out oil between decks. Ship headed to E. & S. Latter part, slightly rain
with variable wind.

Lat 51° 05' N. Long 100° 00' E

Wednesday June 11th Begins with strong East wind, and rainy weather saw Porpoises
steering various courses. Latter part, wind S.E. saw Porpoises & Grampias.

Lat 51° 00' N. Long 100° 00' E

Thursday June 12th Begins with strong winds at S.E. steering various courses
saw Grampias & Porpoises, Latter part strong gales at S. & W. saw a
Finback, started water, employed repairing our old boat, some rain.

Lat 50° 25' N. Long 100° 00' E

Friday June 13th Begins with strong gales at S.W. lying to under storm sail
at work on the boat, Latter part, wind at West. Strong painted
the boat, otherwise variously employed.

Lat 51° 41' N. Long 100° 30' E

Saturday June 14th Begins with strong gales at West, ship under short sail
pursued in various directions, caught fifteen fish, trying hard
to pass away most dismal specimens. Latter part, much the
same.

Lat 52° 21' N. Long 101° 10' E

Sunday June 15th Begins with strong gales at N.W. steering North, raining
employed, Latter part, moderate wind at N.E. with a rainy weather.

Monday June 16th Begins with moderate weather, wind S. mean at N.E.
and rainy weather caught 20 N.W. again weather. Ship here too
Latter part, rather better weather, steering to N.W. employed
on the old boat.

Lat 51° 51' N. Long 101° 50' E

Tuesday June 17th Begins with moderate gales at N.E. and clear
weather steering N.W. caught a little, variously employed
Latter part, fine weather, steering S.W.

Lat 52° 5' N. Long 101° 50' E

Wednesday June 18th Begins with moderate wind at East, steering S.W. saw
Grampias & Porpoises, and a pair of squid, variously employed
Latter part, strong gales and squalls, saw Porpoises.

Lat 51° 51' N. Long 102° 10' E

Thursday June 19th Begins with strong gales at N.W. lying to, head
to the N.W. Middle part, the same. Latter part, calm
caught a shark, containing 10 young, and one with several pieces
of blubber in his mouth.
