

Remarks on Board Ship & Log Book
Monday Dec 18th First part, fine weather and light wind at
10° S. Steering, S.W. latter part, wind 6.0 S. light,

Lat 29° 29' S. Long 157° 16' W.

Tuesday Dec 19th First part, fine weather and moderate wind at
E. N.E. Steering, S.W. at 10° N. saw the island of Mangareva
ahead, dist 15 miles, variously employed, latter part, by 10°
S. 8000 ft at Mangareva, put ashore Ben, a native off the Island
Lick, received a visit from the two MacCains, purchased
a small gun, 100 ft of fowl.

Wednesday Dec 20th First part, wind at S. hailing 10° S.
at Mangareva, at 10° N. kept off W. 1 M. latter part, running
at 9° N. W. huffed to the wind headed to the east.
Saw the island of Ocoratonga dist 20 miles.

Thursday Dec 21th First part, equally passed the Island
of Ocoratonga, stopping a few minutes to land some
letters, at 4° 30' N. kept off E. N. latter part steering, S.W. by
E. N. E.

Lat 22° 25' S. Long 159° 00' W.

Friday Dec 22nd First part, fine weather and strong
wind at E. S. E. Steering, S. N. by W. variously employed
latter part light S. E. wind and fine weather.

Lat 25° 25' S. Long 154° 50' W.

Saturday Dec 23rd First part fine weather and light
wind at E. S. E. Steering, S. W. by N. variously employed
latter part, calm, captured the Fousail.

Lat 25° 35' S. Long 155° 00' W.

Sunday Dec 24th First part, fine weather and calm
started water, latter part, light air at 10° S. steering S. W.

Lat 25° 45' S. Long 155° 50' W.

Monday Dec 25th First part, fine weather and light
wind at 10° S. steering, S. W. saw Opossum, latter part calm.

Lat 25° 55' S. Long 155° 55' W.

Tuesday Dec 26th First part, fine weather and light
wind at 10° S. steering, S. W. latter part, slightly
with changeable wind, rain thunder & lightning, hailing

Lat 26° 10' S. Long 156° 00' W.

Wednesday Dec 27th First part, gale with changeable
wind, rain, thunder & lightning, steering to southward.

while cruising for Sperm Whales
latter part, hailing at 10° and gally.

Lat 26° 30' S. Long 157° 15' W.

Thursday Dec 28th First part, gale with gally at 10° S.
Steering, S. W. latter part fine weather employed,
steering up and set main top gallant sail.

Lat 26° 45' S. Long 157° 55' W.

Friday Dec 29th First part fine weather and strong gally
steering, S. W. by N. variously employed,
latter part to catch the same.

Lat 27° 00' S. Long 158° 00' W.

Saturday Dec 30th First part, fine weather and strong gally
at 10° S. steering, S. W. by N. variously employed,
latter part, watch the same.

Lat 27° 15' S. Long 158° 15' W.

Sunday Dec 31st First part, fine weather and strong gally
at east, steering, S. W. at 10° N. saw Sunday island, bearing S. by E.
dist 26 miles, huffed to the wind headed to E. S. E. latter part
at 5° N. W. saw a body of sperm whales, lowered our
boat alongside of one, missed him, returned to the boat
and took up the boat, Sunday island five miles off.

Lat 29° 00' S. Long 157° 30' W.

Monday Jan 2nd First part, fine weather and strong gally
at east, steering to catch the ship to windward, at sunset
Sunday island bearing, N. E. N. 25 miles dist, latter
part strong gally at 10° S. huff to reduce storm sail.

Tuesday Jan 3rd First part, light rain, and strong gally at
10° S. ship hove to under storm sail, huffed to E. S. E.
variously employed, latter part strong gally reducing
Lat 150° 12' E. Long 157° 50' W.

Wednesday Jan 4th First part, clear weather and
strong gally at 10° N. ship headed to the Maldives
the main top gallant sail and one of the foretop mast
shrouds part cut, latter part, fine weather and moderate wind
at 10° N. steering, S. W. by N. saw Opossum, variously employed

Lat 150° 18' E. Long 157° 27' W.

Thursday Jan 5th First part, fine weather and light wind at 10° N.
steering, S. W. variously employed, saw whale, caught a number of
fish, latter part passed within one mile of the Cocos
