

Remarks on Board Ship *Vermasa* while
Tuesday April 10th First part, fine weather and changing
wind, steering changeable course, N.E. by E. & S.E. by E.
There seems to be a storm brewing in a certain quarter,
Middle & latter part, steering N.E. by E. wind light, at South
Lat 27° 20' S. Long 75° 15' W.

Wednesday April 11th First part, fair weather and light South
wind, steering N.E. by E. Middle part, baffling winds
latter part, strong South wind, steering E. S. E. Saw
a Barque & a Brig, and a great many Chimney stacks
at 11 A.M. saw the land South of the Channel bearing
E. S. E. dist 40 miles, Long by Sun, 74° 4' W.

Thursday April 12th Lat 26° 30' S. Long 75° 30' W.
First part fine weather and strong
South wind, steering E. S. E. for the Paps, at sunset
buffed to the wind, headed S. E. under double reefed
top sail, Capt. dist. 20 miles, Middle part off 2 mi.
latter part, at daylight Paps bore E. S. E. dist 20 miles
kept off E. S. E. light southerly winds, and calm.
Saw a sail. Remarks: Let Ship round for Talch
and obliged to heave to, should keep the Paps
bearing E. S. E. as near as possible, nothing to
the South of that, and at daylight steer E. S. E. by E.
Lat 25° 32' S. Long 75° 23' W.

Friday April 13th First part, fair weather, and light
S.W. wind, at 4 P.M. passed Quiquina point, at 8 P.M.
anchored in Talchukanao Bay, in ten fathoms.
Boarded Brig Judson of San Francisco, at daylight
got underway and steered up the Bay, at 4 P.M.
anchored in 9 fathoms water.

wind and rain, at 2 P.M. took our anchor

and steered out of Balchukanao Bay, saw two sails

outside of Quiquina, Middle part double reefed,

ruled Jit & mainmast, steering N. P. W. latter part

lowered anchor & chains

Lat 26° 32' S. Long 75° 30' W.

Tuesday, May 1st First part, clear weather and S. E.

wind, saw a sail, took in Mast & Bow Boat,

Middle part, light South winds, latter part, calm

saw a school sperm whales towed our boat in pursuit

without success, saw the Lophyr,

Lat 26° 30' S. Long 75° 29' W.

Wednesday, May 2nd First part, strong West wind,

and cloudy weather, steering by the wind to S. P. W.

variously employed, Lophyr. in sight, Middle part

baffling wind, latter part, fine weather with light

West, variously employed, Lat 27° 48' S. Long 77° 49'
