Tuesday July 21st First part fine weather and light
wind at S. Steering N.W. & S. variously employed
Middle & Latter part. wind variable. Saw three
sails. was boarded a land bird, made a cage, put
two dead cockroaches in it, set it on deck, and
caught the bird. Dist 17 miles.

Lat. 30° 35' N Long 63° 15' W
Wednesday July 23rd First part fine weather and
light wind at East. Steering N.W. by N. a sail in sight.
Middle & Latter part. light air & calm.

Lat. 31° 9' N Long 63° 15' W
Thursday July 24th First part fine weather and calm,
a sail in sight. Middle part. a light breeze at N.W.
Steering to N.W. & E. Latter part. Same.

Lat. 31° 52' N Long 63° 20' W
Friday July 27th First part fine weather and moderate
wind at N.W. Steering to N.W. & E. variously employed
Middle & Latter part. moderate winds, at N.W.

Lat. 32° 50' N Long 63° 39' W
Saturday July 28th First part fair weather and
strong breeze at N.W. Steering to N.W. & E. Our little
stranger that boarded us last Tuesday, did today
it had become so tame, that it would perch
on my finger, and eat. Passed America Bay
Chain of Pt. Thomaston. Steering E. & S. Middle
& Latter parts. wind & weather. Same.

Lat. 34° 00' N Long 65° 00' W
Sunday July 29th First part fine weather and
moderate wind at N.W. Steering to N.W. & E. Saw a
sail. Middle part. tacked Ship to N.W. Latter part
boarded Ship New ditto Brig Gen. Wilson of N.W.
Took 7 days from Boston.

Lat. 35° 14' N Long 66° 00' W
Monday July 30th First part fair weather, wind
light at N.W. Steering to N.W. There is a strong
P.W. current here. Middle & Latter part. wind
vary from West to N.W. Saw a sail.

Lat. 36° 04' N Long 66° 23' W

passage towards the United States. Tuesday July 31st
Tuesday July 31st First part. Squally with strong
variable winds. Saw three sail. Steering to N.W. & E.
Middle part steering to N.W. Latter part steering to
North. Strong P.W. current.

Lat. 36° 04' N Long 67° 2' W
Wednesday Aug 1st First part fair weather and light
variable wind from N.W. to N.W. Steering to N.W. & E.
Middle part. full of heavy squalls from N.W.
Thunder, lightning, rain, wind, everything bad
Latter part. better, light wind from several different
quarters. Saw several vessels.

Lat. 37° 00' N Long 67° 34' W
Thursday Aug 2nd First part fair weather and
moderate N.W. winds. Steering N.W. & E. Saw several
sails. Middle part. Same. Latter part. Steering N.W.
Saw two sails. Squally some. Passed Gulf Stream.

Lat. 38° 18' N Long 69° 15' W
Friday Aug 3rd First part fine weather and strong
breeze at N.W. Steering N.W. by N. Middle part strong
winds at East. Steering N.W. by N. Latter part
light winds. Saw several vessels. Saw Albion.

Lat. 39° 39' N Long 71° 00' W
Saturday Aug 4th First part fine weather and
light wind at East. Steering N.W. by N. Saw several vessels.
Middle part. wind light at N.W. Steering
N.W. at daylight saw Gay Head bearing N.E.
dist 20 miles. Latter part. at 3 o'clock took
a Pilot.

Sunday Steering through the
Vineyard Sound. at 4 P.M. anchored
at Cranierket Bar, in 6 fathoms
water.
