

Remarks On Board Bark Northern Lights Of New
Sunday Jan 19th 1868

Commenced with strong breeze and
fine weather from S.W. by the wind to the S.E.
2 sails in light - Ends with light breeze
and fine weather from E.W. Course S.E. &
3 sails in light

Monday Jan 20th

Commenced with fine weather
and light breeze from E.W. Course S.E. &
all sail ends with light breeze and fine
from E.W. all sail to the S.E.

Commenced Hoisting Sail Tuesday Jan 21st 1868

Commenced with fine weather
from E.W. Middle and latter a fresh Gale
from the E. and E.S. with rain

Wednesday Jan 22nd

Commenced with light and
variable winds with thick hazy
weather took in sail at dusk
Ends with fresh breeze from the Westward
Easy sail

Thursday Jan 23rd

Commenced with strong breeze
from the Westward, heading to the Southward
Ends with light breeze and cloudy
weather nothing but Birds in sight

Long 46 51 E

Friday Jan 24th 1868

Commenced with light baffling
ages and fine weather all sail to the
Eastward. Saw a few Finbacks Ends with
fresh Gale from the Eastward

Saturday Jan 25th

Commenced with a fresh Gale
veering to the Westward at 4 p.m. Moderately
middle and latter fresh Gale from the
Westward with clear weather Employed
reparing the upper main top sail

Fresh Gale from the Westward
here to with Horn. Sails set
Vigil the same Ends moderate set top
sails and courses saw a Ice Berg to the
Westward

Monday Jan 27th

Commenced with fine weather
and fresh breeze from N.W. and N.N.W.
heavily S.W. Nothing in sight - Ends with
fine weather Saw Right Whale, lower 3
Boats

Tuesday Jan 28th

Commenced with fine weather
from N.W. Saw a good show of Whales
took one to the Wash Boat - got
him to the ship at 5 p.m. and cut him
lost the head being dug up Ends with
thick fog Employed boiling
No Obs
