 Employed breaking out Shooks at 5 pm Saw
 2 high Whales Lowered look in
 got the Waste Boar Shure Bad
 Lat

Sunday Feb 2nd
 Commenced with a fresh Gale
 Cut the Whale to the lower Ends fine
 started the Works light breeze from
 N.W. thick and foggy
 No Obs

 Commenced with light breeze
 from N.W. Employed boiling Ends with
 light breeze from N.W. Employed boiling
 Saw 2 Sails and a number of Finbacks
 Lat

 from the N.W. at 5 pm Saw a Whale
 Struck Barber from him got fast a

 and fresh breeze from the Northwest by the arrival
 of the Sails

 Commenced with fine weather
 from the Southward Saw a few Finbacks
 and one fair breeze East Ends with fine
