

Remarks On Board Bark Northern Light Of
Sunday April 26th 1864

Commenced with fine weather
from N. Clear away got ready to sail
Saw the Hunter take a whale but before
started the boats. Middle and latter squally
and raining. Employed boiling

Monday April 27th
Commenced with strong breeze
and squally from N. to S.W. Employed
boiling. Ends the same

Tuesday April 28th
Commenced with a fresh Gale from
S.W. finished boiling at 2 p.m. the Hunter
in sight a boiling. Ends with a fresh Gale
and squally. Lat

Wednesday April 29th
Commenced with a fresh Gale and
squally. Short sail. Ends with a fresh Gale
from S.W. and N.E.W. Lat 33.30 S

Thursday April 30th
Commenced with a strong Gale and
clear weather from N.E.W. hauled to under
short sail. Ends with a fresh Gale and clear
pleasant weather from N.E.W. Lat

Friday May 7th
Commenced with strong breeze and
sailed from S.W. at 2 p.m. moderate. Sailed
with the Hunter. Middle light breeze. Ends
Calm. Employed stowing down. Lat

New Bedford Capt Michel Baker Master
Saturday May 2nd 1864

Commenced calm strong down
ends calm and hazy. No Obs

Sunday May 3rd
Commenced calm and raining
middle and latter light breeze and
raining from the Eastward. No Obs

Monday May 4th
Commenced with a heavy
rain storm from the Eastward. Set off from
a strong Gale. Middle the same. Ends
moderate and foggy. No Obs

Tuesday May 5th
Commenced calm and foggy
at 4 p.m. a strong Gale from S.W.
with a heavy sea running. Ends
with fresh Gales and thick rain. No Obs

Wednesday May 6th
Commenced with squally from
S.E. Short sail. No weather. Sea
or air anything. Ends with strong breeze
and fine weather from S.W. to S.W. all
sail to the Westward. Lat 34.30 S
Long 175.36 W

Thursday May 7th
Commenced with strong breeze
and clear weather from S.W. all sail
by the wind to the Westward. Middle fine
weather at 7 am. Saw Cape Breton being
S.W. stood in till 11 and took a Gale
had to wear ship off shore and heaved
to a strong Gale with heavy rain
from the Westward.
